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Antarctic luxury rivalry heats up

A New Zealand-based firm claims it has the cheapest luxury cruises in Antarctica.

WILD EARTH TRAVEL IS PROMOTING "THE cheapest trips on the nicest ships" in Antarctica with its upcoming voyages on Compagnie du Ponant's mega-yachts Le Boreal and L'Austral.

The lowest fare for its *Le Boreal* cruise to the Antarctic Peninsula is US\$7,747 per person and the "average price" is US\$10,756pp.

According to Wild Earth general manager Aaron Russ, a comparable voyage on highend competitor, Silversea's Silver Explorer, is priced from US\$12,373 with an average fare of US\$15,478.

Russ also analysed the cost of One Ocean Expeditions' Akademik Ioffe, a research vessel which has introduced "adventure concierges", and found its voyages are priced from US\$10,290 pp (triple cabin; shared facilities) with an average price of US\$12,990 per person.

Russ' analysis compared the three companies' Falklands, South Georgia and Antarctica cruises in November 2011, converting fares to US dollars based on yesterday's exchange rate.

"As you can see, the *Le Boreal* is the cheapest of the options," he told *Cruise* **Weekly** yesterday.

"[Le Boreal and L'Austral] are a good bit larger and do carry more passengers [than the 132-passenger Silver Explorer] but they are limited to 199 guests in Antarctica which means that they can still stop at any landing sites, with the guests landing in two groups of 100 at a time – this is the same situation aboard the Silver Explorer."

The Akademik Ioffe carries only 98 passengers.

"Its main advantage is that everybody is

able to go ashore at once", Russ said.

Andrew Prossin, CEO, One Ocean Expeditions, told **CW** it was important to consider the quality of the expedition program and customer service.

"Our ship is very comfortable but it's not for someone who needs a fancy bathroom," Prossin said.

"We have transformed the way we deliver our service onboard and we're seeing a real difference since we introduced the adventure concierges for every guest."

Steve Odell, Silversea's senior vice president of sales and marketing, said *Silver Explorer* is the highest rated and most inclusive expedition product operating in the region, with butler service and 24-hour room service

"Silversea Expedition fares are all inclusive of wines, champagnes and spirits, gratuities and all shore experiences," he pointed out.

'Wave season' to start earlier

Australia's summer cruise season will begin in September – and not in Sydney.

THE FIRST SHIP TO BE REDEPLOYED FOR THE 2011-12 season, Princess Cruises' Sun Princess, will arrive in Brisbane on 21 September – ahead of the traditional October launch.

Last year, the 2010-11 wave season kicked off in Sydney with two Princess ships, and the first international ship was Royal Caribbean's Rhapsody of the Seas on 16

Queenslanders can have a preview of Sun Princess next Thursday when it docks at Portside Wharf at 7.30am.

'The 28 July arrival is just a one-day visit as she's en route from Fremantle to Sydney," a Princess Cruises spokesperson told Cruise

Weekly this week.

"There will be another Brisbane call four days later as she heads back to Fremantle from Sydney."

Sun Princess was based in Sydney last season but moves up to Brisbane this season – the first time Princess Cruises has based a ship in Queensland.

The line is sending the younger Sea Princess to Sydney as a replacement, arriving on 17 October.

But the harbour city's first international ship will be Holland America Line's Volendam, arriving 4 October.

Australia's first 21st-century superliner, Radiance of the Seas, commences its inaugural Sydney departures on 15 October, joining Royal Caribbean fleetmate Rhapsody.

Other newcomers calling Sydney home for the first time this season include Holland America's Zaandam, from 25 November, and Celebrity Cruises' Celebrity Century, from 30 November.


Speaking with Fred Olsen

Atomic Cruising turns Fifty by Roderick Eime


Discounting the re-purposed Russian icebreakers taking adventurers to the North Pole and three purely cargo vessels built around the same time, this technical and political folly was conceived at the height of the Cold War as a showcase for Eisenhower's so-called "Atoms for Peace" program devised to share the nuclear knowledgebank for altruistic purposes.

In other words, propaganda.

As such, the NS Savannah was





But almost as soon as construction began in 1959, her shortcomings and flaws became apparent, yet she was a star at the 1962 Seattle World's Fair.

Technically impressive with her 20,000 hp nuclear engine, her top speed was 23 knots and was capable of circling the earth 14 times at 20 knots without refuelling.

Despite grandiose intentions and the successful operation of a new type of pressurized water reactor, utilizing low-enriched uranium, the commercial market for such a vessel

Named after the similarly innovative SS Savannah, the first steam-powered vessel to cross the Atlantic in 1819, the new nuclear ship would also prove to be far ahead of its time and just as economically disastrous.

Costing the best part of US\$50million to build and with several million dollars annual running costs coupled to specialised wharf and port requirements, crew training and engineering, the project was never going to be a financial success.

Although ungainly and compromised as a functioning cargo vessel, her passenger and public spaces were superb.

With accommodation for just 60 guests in fully air-conditioned suites with private facilities, there was certainly a feel of exclusivity and luxury about travelling aboard the NS Savannah.

A luxury 100-seat dining room, swimming pool, library and theatre all looked good on the brochure, but her passenger carrying days came to an abrupt end in 1965, just three years into her service life.

From then on, NS Savannah continued as a cargo ship, a role she did not fulfil well due to the many compromises in her design, and she ceased all revenue services in 1971 and has been laid up ever since.

Coincidently, when taken out of service, bunker fuel was \$20/ton, but with Energy

Crisis just months away, fuel quickly rose to \$80/ton.


Bad timing.

It has been proposed to maintain her as a museum ship and as such NS Savannah was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1991.

After a decommissioning cost of over \$1 million, she now resides at the Canton Marine Terminal in Baltimore awaiting an uncertain fate.
