### RCL opens summer

**ROYAL Caribbean International** has officially opened sales on its 2020/21 Australian summer cruising season, with four of the brand's megaliners set to visit local shores (**CW** 20 Mar).  
The 2,400-passenger *Radiance of the Seas* is offering a range of cruises starting from \$809 per person, while *Serenade of the Seas* is offering 21 Sydney sailings ranging from five- to 19-nights. *Ovation of the Seas* will return for her fifth Australian season, while *Voyager of the Seas* will set sail in the Pacific from Oct 2020 - book **HERE**.

## Kangaroo Island's visitor centre turmoil

**THE** Kangaroo Island Visitor Centre has temporarily closed its doors after the tourist office reportedly ran out of money to pay its staff, leaving visitors to the island without a main tourist hub.

The closure comes after several cruise lines pledged their support to South Australia, including Princess Cruises who last month revealed plans to double its cruises to and from Adelaide and the greater state for the 2020/21 cruise season, including making a series of calls at Kangaroo Island (**CW** 20 Mar).

The closure prompted a call for emergency funding to prop up the business, with SA Tourism Minister David Ridgway, voicing his commitment to the centre's reopening in a statement to news service *The Advertiser*.

"I recognise the importance of the Kangaroo Island Visitor Centre to the local community and look



forward to working with the local council, through the South Australian Tourism Commission, to discuss ways in which they may reopen it," Ridgway said.

Kangaroo Island's Mayor, Michael Pengilly, also listed a number of options that could be employed to save the centre, including council running the centre, putting it out to tender, as well as putting a levy on cruise

ship passengers.

"We need to have it operating... but we won't be railroaded into a cash handout in tight times," he said in a statement.

Kangaroo Island experienced its "busiest ever cruise ship season" in 2018/19, with the total number of ships visiting the region climbing to 28, compared with 19 the previous season.

## New Rhine ship

**GERMAN** cruise line A-ROSA Flussschiff GmbH has announced it has commissioned the construction of a new ship, slated for delivery in 2021.

The new vessel, which will operate using a battery-powered drive and air-bubble technology will be deployed mainly along the northern parts of the Rhine River, departing Cologne and calling in at Amsterdam, Rotterdam, Bruges, and Antwerp.

"At 135 metres long and 17.7 metres wide - and with a fourth deck - the new ship will provide more space for us to not only meet our guests' expectations, but to exceed them," said Jorg Eichler, Managing Director of A-ROSA Flussschiff GmbH.

The ship will offer 140 double cabins at 21m<sup>2</sup>.

## Solstice's island debut



**THE** Australian-based *Celebrity Solstice* recently made maiden calls to the Pacific island nations of Samoa and Tonga.

Visits during the sailing included a stop in the Samoan capital Apia, where passengers were greeted by locals on arrival before being offered the chance to participate in a range of shore excursions such as guided visits to the local food markets, adventures to the lush Falefa Falls and Falefa Village, or a road trip along the northeastern coast of the island.

*Solstice* then set course for its first visit to the Tongan island group Vava'u, with guests treated to a traditional performance by local dancers on arrival, before

taking on more shore activities such as a scenic boat cruise to the nearby island of Kapa and a trip across the island to Ene'io Beach, accompanied by an ocean-side lunch of local delicacies.

The final leg of the inaugural cruise included a call in at the Tongan capital Nuku'Alofa, with adventures in the scenic city seeing passengers venturing to the island's Houma Blowholes and jumping on a ferry ride to the deserted island of Pangaimotu for a snorkelling safari of a sunken shipwreck.

*Solstice* will return to the islands again on 08 Apr 2020.

**CRUISE** and Maritime Voyages (CMV) last week invited guests on board its ship *Astor* to contribute to assisting the humanitarian crisis in Mozambique, Malawi and Zimbabwe.

*Astor* visited Maputo, in the south of Mozambique, where CMV encouraged guests to help the aid and relief program in recognition of the current crisis in Mozambique.

"As an organisation, we're committed to supporting the destinations we visit and we're thankful that we are able to give back to the region in this time of need," said Dean Brazier, MD of

CMV Australia.

Maputo is in the south of Mozambique and is largely unaffected by the Cyclone Idai.

CMV and its guests managed to raise \$14,060 for the relief program.

However, over 3,100km<sup>2</sup> of the country in the northern Beira coastal region has been flooded.

The 21,000grt *Astor* is currently on a 43-night northbound voyage from Australia to the UK with 552 guests on board.


