Viking Cruises fraudster sentenced

YET another cruise industry finance scandal was laid to rest yesterday, with the sentencing of Lisa Maree Jeffers to a two-year custodial prison sentence.

44-year-old Jeffers, who was the Office Manager for Viking Cruises between 2014 and 2017, was accused of embezzlement, after an internal review discovered seemingly dodgy invoices.

A subsequent investigation coincided with Jeffers' departure from the company in Oct 2017, and following a full audit the matter was referred to the NSW Police Service.

The Office Manager allegedly created false invoices to perpetrate the fraud, ultimately stealing more than \$160,000 from the company.

Court appearance records for the case, number 2018/00325203, indicate no less



than 13 hearing dates, with the first police mention at the Local Court in Hornsby, NSW in late Jan this year.

It appears Jeffers initially intended to defend the charges, but ultimately pleaded guilty at the 11th hour, on the day of the actual court proceedings.

Subsequently several court dates for sentencing were not attended by Jeffers, who was ultimately compelled to appear yesterday when she received the prison term.

The court also ordered her to repay \$150,000 to Viking Cruises.

The sentencing follows two similar cases in the last month or so - one in which Mary Ann Abellanoza, the former book keeper for Silversea Cruises, was given eight years for an elaborate \$3.7 million fraud (CW 06 Nov), and Susanne Hunter, wife of former Cruise & Maritime Voyages CEO Grant Hunter, who was given 15 months for defrauding \$2.4 million from the business (CW 21 Nov).

CLIA clarifies crime

CRUISE Lines International Association (CLIA) has pushed back against media reports citing a rise in sexual assaults on cruise ships (CW 04 Dec), suggesting the data released by the US Department of Transportation also illuminates the safety of cruise holidays.

"The latest Department of Transportation report shows that allegations of serious crime on board cruise ships remain extremely rare, especially compared to crimes that occur on land," CLIA said.

"A study of crime data from Jan 2015 to Dec 2018 by criminologist James Alan Fox found that overall crime rates on board cruise ships are 25 times lower compared to a typical city in the US, with the rate of reported sexual assaults on cruise ships just 30% the rate on land".

Silversea bridges the gap



SILVERSEA Cruises has announced the details of a new fly-cruise service to Antarctica it plans to formally launch to the market next week, making it more obtainable for Aussie guests to cruise the remote continent.

The new Antarctica Bridge service allows for passengers to be flown Business class directly to Antarctica from Punta Arenas near the tip of Chile's southernmost Patagonia region, saving a total of four days at sea on the return journey.

The new collection of 12 flycruise voyages aboard Silver Explorer consolidates Silversea's push on the polar regions, and also marks the largest Antarctica offering in the line's history. "This is a defining moment for Silversea's expedition offering, Antarctica Bridge will revolutionise the way in which our guests discover Antarctica," said Silversea Senior Vice President of Tour Operating, Expedition & Destination Management Conrad Combrink.

ON 26 Dec, a fleet of around 85 yachts will converge in Sydney Harbour for the annual Rolex Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race including a 115-year-old yacht purchased off Gumtree, set to be the oldest-ever entrant.

Bill Barry-Cotter purchased the vessel two years ago in "very bad shape", after searching for a decade for the boat that was originally owned by his father.

Sailing Katwinchar was built in 1904 but, despite its impressively long life, has only completed one race in its lifetime, sailing to Hobart on New Year's Eve in 1951.

Bill and his brother Kendal (pictured below) lovingly restored the yacht just in time for the upcoming race, with Kendal at the helm and a capable crew, including sailing icon Michael Spies, who has competed in the race 43 times.

Building towards Lyttelton

WE ARE two months into the 2019-20 cruise season and there has been an impressive six to 10 ships visiting each day in New Zealand ports this month.

New Zealand has been building up port infrastructure to cope with an increasing number of ships and many multi-ship days.

In Feb 2001, Canterbury was hit with a devastating earthquake, which unfortunately forced the closure of operations in the main port of Lyttelton.

As a result of the stoppage, cruise ships were moved to the small tender port of Akaroa and passengers were able to continue to take tours into Christchurch and the region.

Once the port became operational again, smaller cruise ships started coming back to Lyttelton, as it offers a much closer proximity to the city and its attractions.

But the larger ships passed by. Now that is changing, Lyttelton is building a new berth designed to take the largest cruise ships planned for New Zealand providing full access to the South Island main ports.

Lyttelton Port Company invited NZCA to visit the port and see what was happening and to let us know their plans for the future.

The new berth will be operational in Nov 2020 and they already have bookings for 80 ships.
