HAL cancellation

A TECHNICAL issue with one of Nieuw Amsterdam's two Azipod propulsion systems has caused the cancellation of Holland America Line's (HAL) 14 Dec cruise from Fort Lauderdale.

Scheduled to cruise the Caribbean, HAL made a request to sail with just one of the propulsion systems, but it was not approved in time for a "satisfactory itinerary", the cruise line said in a statement.

"[HAL] is working with guests to assist with travel arrangements and provide support," the statement read, with several guests rebooked on other cruises.
