THE Government of Panama has issued a tender for the ongoing operation of the new Panama Cruise Terminal which is currently under construction near the Pacific entrance to the Panama Canal.

### Viking rescues passengers by chopper

ALL passengers and crew on board Viking Cruises' Viking Sky are safe, following a weekend of high drama which saw them airlifted from the vessel off the coast of western Norway.

The company's founder and CEO, Torstein Hagen, has flown to the remote Norwegian village of Molde to personally comfort the passengers after the rescue, which took more than 15 hours. At least four helicopters were mobilised to airlift those on board to shore, after the ship's engines failed during high seas and it

began drifting towards the land. "Our first priority was for the safety and wellbeing of our passengers and our crew, and in close cooperation with the Norwegian Coast Guard, the captain decided to evacuate all guests from the vessel by helicopter," according to an official statement from Viking.



The "brutal conditions" forced two Norwegian Society for Sea Rescue vessels to turn back, while air evacuations were also undertaken for a nearby cargo ship which was also in trouble.

Viking Sky was just over half way through its current "In Search of the Northern Lights" itinerary between Bergen and Tilbury in the UK.

The crew managed to drop the anchor and eventually restart

the engines, and the ship has proceeded to safety under its own power with tugboats also in attendance.

Viking said its next sailing, "Scandinavia & the Kiel Canal" which was scheduled to embark on 27 Mar, had been cancelled, with impacted guests and travel agents currently being contacted. "We do not anticipate any

additional cancellations at this time," the company said.

## Bahamas cruise growth



**THE** Bahamas Ministry of Tourism & Aviation has revealed last year was a "record-breaking" year for cruise ship arrivals to the popular Caribbean destination.

By the end of 2018, foreign air and sea arrivals had totalled more than 6.6 million visitors, a significant increase on the 6.1 million visitors recorded in the previous corresponding period. Cruise visitors alone in 2018

surged by 49%. The pleasing numbers follow news that the country will be expanding its port in the capital Nassau, increasing the number of cruise berths from six to eight (*CW* 27 Feb 2019).

"We look forward to building upon the success of our progressive plans and continuing the momentum in 2019 as we forge ahead with exciting new initiatives," said Bahamas Tourism and Aviation Minister Dionisio D'aguilar.

### Royal Caribbean sued after ride accident

**ROYAL** Caribbean is facing a lawsuit after a man broke his pelvis while riding the Sky Pad bungee aboard *Mariner of the Seas* last month. Casey Holladay filed a claim against the cruise line and is suing for \$A14m after falling six metres to the deck after his harness snapped. When approached for comment, the cruise line said: "We do not comment on pending litigation. We operate all our ships safely,

professionally and responsibly". The Sky Pad bungee is found on board Royal Caribbean's *Mariner* of the Seas & Independence of the Seas which don't sail to Australia.
