Hurtigruten to assist One Ocean pax

HURTIGRUTEN Cruises is offering special "compassionate fares" to Australasian travellers impacted by the repeated cancellations of voyages by One Ocean Expeditions (OOE).

Industry concern continues to rise over the future of OOE, which vesterday cancelled a fourth itinerary as it undergoes what its CEO has described as a "difficult period of restructuring".

It's believed that once again no refunds are being offered, with the newly cancelled voyage being an 11-day Falkland Islands cruise due to depart this Sun.

Earlier this week CATO MD Brett Jardine warned agents about OOE (CW 25 Nov), with the industry particularly wary given the lack of transparency around the recent collapse of Tempo/Bentours despite repeated assurances that it was "business as usual".



Hurtigruten is once again stepping into the breach, via significant fare reductions for pax directly impacted by cancelled cruises, or future potential cancellations this season.

Hurtigruten MD Damian Perry (pictured) said the initiative was in line with the firm's core values.

"We care...we care about the environment, cultures, oceans, and we care about travellers."

The offer is being made independently, and will not resolve disputes between OOE and travellers over cancellations.

"Yet we understand the stress this causes agents and travellers.

"Guests may get some comfort that they will travel at a premium standard with one of the industry's most recognised expedition teams and operations on Hurtigruten, at a heavily reduced compassionate fare," Perry said.

To apply for a special fare, agents need to email Hurtigruten on ApacAssist@hurtigruten.com.

"This is not a giveaway, not a refund for their existing booking or a windfall for agents, as nobody wins in these circumstances," Perry said.

He said Hurtigruten would take a financial hit on these offers, "but we believe it is the right thing to do for the traveller and for the trade to lift its professionalism while rebuilding trust with consumers.

"Our focus is on the traveller and the professional agents in the market that value putting the traveller first," Perry concluded.









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Bourbon and cruise



A NEW American river cruise package with American Queen Steamboat Company is available aboard upcoming riverboat, American Countess.

To be launched in Apr, travellers can currently score savings of up to US\$2,000 on the seven-night Bourbon and Blues river cruise.

The itinerary takes guests along the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers, peeking behind the curtain of Kentucky's bourbon

region, departing Louisville on 05 Jul and arriving in Memphis on 12 Jul, with stops in Madison, Brandenbug, Owensboro, Henderson, Paducah and New Madrid.

The cruise will also feature live blues performances; cooking demonstrations; special talks from guest historians, and several hop-on, hop-off excursions.

A hat trick for Lotus



VIETNAM-BASED luxury expedition cruise line Lotus Cruises plans to introduce a new boutique, 14-cabin ship RV Mekong Muse from Oct 2021.

The new vessel will offer "exotic journeys on the Upper Mekong River in Laos" and will join the cruise line's existing ship RV Mekong Navigator (pictured), as well as another vessel on order, RV Mekong Jewel, due to join the fleet in 2020.

Mekong Muse will offer 10-night itineraries, both upstream and downstream, between Vientiane and Chiang Saen in Laos, in addition to shorter five-night itineraries between Vientiane

and Luang Prabang or between Chiang Saen and Luang Prabang.

Features on board the ship are set to include a large sun deck, three suite types including two Grande Suites, which at 30m² are billed by Lotus as "the largest suite sailing on the Upper Mekong River", as well as six Signature Suites, which offers guests 20m2.

More Royal Caribbean San Juan cancels?

ROYAL Caribbean has denied reports in the Puerto Rican media it plans to cancel 90 calls to the capital of San Juan for the 2020-21

Royal Caribbean International in Jul cancelled two scheduled stops in the city due to political unrest (CW 19 Jul), but denied it had yet made any wholesale cancellations for the season, despite indications

"Royal Caribbean reviews and adjusts itineraries and deployments every year," the company said in a statement.

"The rumours regarding cancellations of sailings departing between Apr 2020-Mar 2022 from San Juan are incorrect...we have not cancelled any of our ships visiting or homeporting in San Juan."
