Viking Cruises targets group bookings

VIKING Cruises has created a dedicated Groups Coordinator role along with a groups toolkit for travel agents, with the aim of simplifying the group booking journey for clients.

Travel consultants wanting to design a hosted or special interest departure on Viking's river and ocean cruise products will now deal directly with Amy Swearingen, who will "seamlessly manage every element of a group booking, from initial enquiries and pricing right through to contracts and bookings".

Swearingen will also act as a liaison between travel agents and the in-house Viking marketing team to help promote the departures.

A range of bonus value-adds are also available for group bookings with Viking, including free travel for one person when five or more staterooms are booked



on a China, Europe or Russia river cruise, or more than eight staterooms on board an ocean voyage or a Portugal river cruise.

Each person within the group booking also receives a \$150 discount.

Group fares are fully commissionable, and are eligible for current market offers at the time of signing the contract, while past passenger discounts also apply on group bookings, with Viking noting it is the only line with no non-commissionable fees

(NCFs), paying agents commission on every aspect of bookings including flights, pre-booked beverage packages and more.

Hapag-Lloyd's Inspiration



HAPAG-LLOYD Cruises held the naming ceremony for its HANSEATIC Inspiration last Fri night in Hamburg.

Inspiration is the second of three new Hapag-Lloyd expedition ships, with the vessel named by godmorther Laura Dekker, the youngest person to ever circumnavigate the globe single-handed.

The event (pictured) saw the new ship transformed into a gigantic screen, with 11 highpowered projectors using the vessel as a backdrop for a multimedia show taking the audience on a virtual cruise through some of the destinations the ship will visit - including icy landscapes, whales, penguins, jungles, birds and other landscapes.

"Today's naming ceremony has given our guests a taste of the expedition cruises which they can experience on the HANSEATIC Inspiration from now on," said Hapag-Lloyd Cruises CEO, Karl Pojer during the event.

The three-strong Hapag-Lloyd expedition fleet sees the company "positioning [itself] in the exclusive five-star expedition segment," according to Pojer.

The vessel cruised to Antwerp over the weekend, and departs today on a 15-day inaugural voyage to Tenerife via La Coruna, Lisbon, Casablanca and Madeira.

Inspiration carries a maximum of 230 guests, or 199 on Antarctic cruises and circumnavigations of Spitsbergen, served by about 175 crew members.


Hapag-Lloyd Cruises earlier in the month announced that from Jul 2020 its entire fleet would cease the use of heavy fuel oil, and instead use low-pollutant marine gas oil fuel on all routes (CW 02 Oct).



Heritage hosts Forest & Bird voyage

On demand ferries

SYDNEY'S On Demand ferry trial begins today, with the first service setting sail this morning from the Bays Precinct.

Bringing customers to Barangaroo from Blackwattle Bay, Fish Markets and Pirrama Park, services are available between 7am and 10pm on weekdays and 8:30am and 7:30pm on weekends.

A single trip costs \$7.60 for adults and \$3.80 for concessions, and is available to be booked on the Tranzer application.

The services will be operated on a new 12-metre MiniCat with a capacity of 60

"The Bays Precinct is popular with both tourists and regular public transport customers," **NSW Minister for Transport** Andrew Constance said.

"The wharves selected for this trial are not currently serviced by regular ferries so the new On Demand service will help to connect this area to a major transport hub."

Cunard cuts

THE first steel has been cut for the construction of Cunard's newest ship.

The build of the as-yet unnamed ship is taking place at Fincantieri's Castellammare di Stabia Shipyard.

Now constructing the line's 249th ship, the Italian shipyard also delivered Queen Victoria in 2007 and Queen Elizabeth in 2010

"The 249th Cunarder will be our fourth luxury liner for the 21st century," said Cunard President Simon Palethorpe.

"The new ship is taking inspiration from the success of our past, intergrating the Cunard spirit with exciting new concepts."

She is expected to be delivered in Monfalcone, Gorizia, Italy, in 2022, with bookings set to commence next year.

Crystal photo trip

CRYSTAL Cruises has announced a special photography-themed departure aboard its new Crystal Endeavor in 2020.

"Master Photographer" Nick Rains, who is Leica Akademie Australia's Principal Instructor, will join the "Indonesian Immersive & the Great Barrier Reef" sailing from Bali to Cairns departing 15 Oct 2020.

Expedition guests will be able to participate in travel photography lectures on board, as well as pick up tips and tricks ashore on select landings, with Crystal MD Australasia, Karen Christensen saying the journey "will only be enhanced as guests look through the lens of an expert such as Nick".

Crystal Endeavor will carry a maximum of 200 guests along with a team of butlers.

Princess' new Discovery



PRINCESS Cruises last week revealed the name of its sixth Royal class ship will be *Discovery* Princess.

Debuting on 03 Nov 2021 in time for the 2021/22 season, Discovery will embark on itineraries to the California Coast, the Caribbean, Mexico and South America.

In total, the inaugural season includes 30 departures on 21 unique itineraries to more than 50 destinations in 23 countries.

Sailing out of Los Angeles, she is the first Princess ship to be based on the US West Coast.

With itineraries now on sale, her first itinerary will be a seven-day Mediterranean & Aegean cruise from Rome to Athens.

Costa ups Italy

COSTA Cruises's flagship Costa Smeralda will call Cagliari once a week during summer from May 2020.

The line also flagged that Costa Pacifica will visit Catania during summer 2020.

Also visiting Palermo in winter, the changes are intended to increase the line's presence in Sardinia and Sicily.

Currently under construction, Smeralda is nearing completion in its Finnish shipyard (CW 14 Sep 2017).



GENTING Cruise Line's first Global-Class vessel, Dream Cruises' Global Dream, is an exciting prospect, but is now set to ramp that excitement up to 10.

Dream on Fri promised the ship would deliver the longest roller coaster at sea, the Space Cruiser, set to be the centrepiece of the ship's Dream Park at the Pier - the first amusement park at sea.

The cruise line is teaming up with Maurer Rides for the attraction, with Global Dream currently under construction and set to launch in early 2021.

Reportedly, the roller coaster is "outfitted with powerful electric motors" and a "positive-locking drive system".
