P&O preps "new concept" in entertainment

P&O Cruises will introduce a "new concept" in family entertainment to Australia when Pacific Adventure arrives in 2020.

The ship will feature a suite of new indoor and outdoor family entertainment options, with P&O Cruises President Sture Myrmell suggesting the additions matched the appetites of Aussie families and what they expected from a cruise holiday.

"We spend a lot of time listening to what our guests want from a cruise and have seen a growing demand for familyfriendly entertainment areas where family groups can spend... time together," Myrmell said.

"The new family entertainment area means kids and family groups can have a bit of fun together in some friendly competition over a game or two, listening to great music or hitting the waterslide or indoor-outdoor



pool," he added.

The suite of attractions available on board Pacific Adventure will include two 135m water tubes called Twin Racer (pictured), a waterslide specifically designed for families to race each other.

The vessel will also offer P&O Edge Adventure Park, which boasts thrill rides such as a flying fox, "Walk the Plank" and a rock climbing wall.

Families can choose to dance the day away at P&O's exclusive family-only deck party, enjoy a

range of games like lawn bowls, table tennis, hop scotch, and order pizza for the family from anywhere on the ship.

Adventure arrives in Sydney on Oct 2020, with fares leading in from \$849 per person twin share.

Greg is on track

AURORA Expeditions' new Greg Mortimer ship is tracking ahead of schedule as it crosses The Atlantic Ocean in preparation for an official Christening ceremony in Argentina and maiden voyage departing 31 Oct.

Greg Mortimer was able to maintain 12 knots despite facing eight-metre swells on the journey, with previous non X-BOW ships typically forced to slow down to eight knots during the same conditions.

The ship will undertake a special shack down voyage on 23 Oct, crossing the Drake Passage, running landings in Antarctica, before returning to Ushuaia, Argentina on 30 Oct.

The purpose-built ship uses a patented Ulstein X-BOW which allows for a smoother ride, faster speeds, & lower fuel consumption & air emissions.

Top end kicks off season



THE arrival of Dream Cruises' Explorer Dream in Darwin for the first time over the weekend officially signalled the start of the cruise season in the Top End.

The upcoming season is expected to bring more than 64,000 visitors to the region and inject millions of dollars into the NT economy over the next year.

Seventy-six cruise and expeditionary ships are scheduled for the period, with five vessels to port in Darwin on their maiden visits including Carnival Splendor (02 Dec), Boudicca (14 Jan), Queen Elizabeth (17 Mar), and MSC Magnifica (30 Mar).

NT Minister for Tourism, Sport and Culture Lauren Moss said the cruise sector was particularly

important to the NT because of the timing of the cruise season.

"Crucially, the cruise season runs over the traditionally quieter low season providing a welcome revenue boost for operators and retailers over that period," Moss

"Cruise ships stimulate the Territory economy by providing an influx of tourists into our region with passengers and crew undertaking tours, visiting local attractions and shopping at local retail outlets, cafes and restaurants," Moss added.

Carrying up to 2,800 passengers, Explorer Dream will follow up her maiden visit by returning in Mar for an overnight stay.

Burnie cuts greeting

BURNIE Council has softened a proposal for its councillors to meet and greet cruise ship passengers during the 2019/2020 season.

Many councillors argued the original motion, which stipulated they must greet at least four ships during the period, was of little benefit because passengers were already being welcomed by Mayor Steve Kons.

Burnie City Council recently voted instead for every councillor to "attempt to accompany the mayor in greeting the cruise ships".

The Tasmanian port city is expecting 39 visits this season.

Cyprus restoration

THE first cruise ship to sail between Egypt and Cyprus completed its journey last week following a 10-year hiatus.

Cyprus-based Salamis Cruises sailed its Salamis Filoxenia vessel to Alexandria, a voyage that saw Alexandria Governor Abdel Aziz Qansouh greet 500 pax on arrival.

"This trip was based on an agreement signed 10 months ago," Qansouh said.

"There is coordination with the mayor of Paphos to see to it that the Salamis Filoxenia visits Alexandria twice a week, and that the two cities will be linked to a low-cost airline after six months." he added.

Cyprus has been working to deepen tourist ties with Egypt.


