Royal Caribbean looks to Oct relaunch

ROYAL Caribbean International believes there is a possiblity of recommencing operations in Australia within the next two months, according to the brand's President & Chief Executive Officer Michael Bayley.

Speaking to investors following the second quarter earnings announcement of parent company Royal Caribbean Group (RCG), Bayley noted the company's sailings are currently suspended across the globe, with potential for China and Australia to be first for a restart.

"It may well be possible that we'll resume operations in China, and potentially Australia, before the end of Oct but it's uncertain," Bayley said.

"I'm not making any statements that's going to happen, but there's some possibility."

Bayley also suggested Royal Caribbean was considering

compulsory COVID-19 swab testing for all passengers prior to embarkation in some markets.

"Testing seems to be very relevant and discussions are under way," he said, adding it was too early to release further info.

However "particularly as it relates to the Caribbean, that testing is very much at the front of how people are thinking of protocols for returning," Bayley added.

The comments about an Australian recommencement came as the group reported a US\$1.6 billion net loss for the three months to 30 Jun.

Royal Caribbean Group is currently burning between US\$250 million and US\$290 million in cash per month while operations are suspended, and is "considering ways to further reduce its average monthly cash burn under a further prolonged out-of-service scenario and

during restart of operations". **RCG Chief Executive Richard Fain** noted the impact COVID-19 was having on shipyard operations, which will result in delivery delays for a number of newbuilds.

However Silversea's Silver Moon will still arrive this year, followed by Royal Caribbean International's Odyssey of the Seas in the first quarter of 2021 and Silversea's Silver Dawn in 2021.

Other ships previously scheduled for delivery next year, including Wonder of the Seas and Celebrity Beyond, are now expected to arrive in 2022.

"The COVID-19 pandemic is posing an unprecedented challenge to our industry and society," Fain said.

"Our teams are working tirelessly to return to service soonest and doing so by developing new health and safety protocols."

Beirut tragedy


TWO crew members aboard Mehri Cruises' *Orient Queen* have been killed, and the vessel left shipwrecked, in the recent Beirut explosions.

Orient Queen was severely damaged by Tue's ammonium nitrate explosions while moored at her berth, after which she began severely listing.

A surviving crew member interviewed following the blast revealed the ship's interior had been totally destroyed, and later in the night, the vessel capsized and then partially sunk, after her list worsened.

Orient Queen arrived in Beirut on 27 Jun following a 22-day voyage from Saudi Arabia.
