FCO cruise advice

THE United Kingdom's Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO) is now advising against cruise ship travel, a hardening of its previous advice that only over-70s and those with existing health conditions avoid the sector.

The advice is the first update pertaining to cruise ships since Mar, and is down to "the ongoing pandemic and is based on medical advice from Public Health England.

"The government will continue to review its cruise ship travel advice based on the latest medical advice," the Foreign & Commonwealth Office said.

Hapag-Lloyd to resume cruising

HAPAG-LLOYD Cruises will resume operations at the end of the month, with a 10-point health plan and new routes.

Cruises will resume later this Jul, initially for residents of Germany, Austria and Switzerland, with 40% fewer passengers and extensive prevention and hygiene measures onboard.

The eight new short cruises will sail roundtrip from Hamburg, aboard *Europa 2* and *Hanseatic Inspiration*.

The resumption follows the development of guidelines from relevant authorities, which have been produced in coordination with members of Cruise Lines International Association Deutschland, and in collaboration with experts.

Hapag-Lloyd's 10-point health plan will be based on these new guidelines, and will include mandatory health disclosure, the



use of thermal imaging cameras, a staggered boarding process, and rigorous training, health checks & quarantining of crews.

There is also a supervised medical team onboard and emergency plans in place.

Guests will also be given a care

set which includes face masks, and will only stay in outside staterooms.

Hapag-Lloyd will aim to integrate the new standards into life on board as seamlessly as possible.

The Crystal Confidence policy is applicable to all 2020 sailings booked before 31 Jul, with guests able to cancel up to seven days prior to sailing for a 100% future cruise credit on any voyage through to the end of 2022.

Final payment is also now due 90 days prior to sailing, having previously been 120 or more.

The cruises are available from Nov 2020 to Feb 2021, and range from seven to 10 nights, exploring destinations such as Abu Dhabi, Cambodia, India, Malaysia, Myanmar, Oman, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam.
