#### H-L to require test

HAPAG-LLOYD Cruises (H-L) will require a negative PCR test as a condition to embark.

The expansion of the cruise line's COVID-19 measures will begin from 15 Sep, with the cost for the test included in the travel price.

Passengers will receive a voucher for the test valid in 86 hospitals operated by Helios Kliniken throughout Germany.

The results must be received within 48 hours-72 hours of embarkation, depending on the date of sailing.

## Cruise ban extended to Dec **CRUISE** Lines International now be in place until 17 Dec.

Association (CLIA) has acknowledged the extension of the cruise ship suspension in Australian waters (CW breaking news), and has flagged the formation of a working group with government to "progress a pathway to a carefully managed and responsible resumption of cruise tourism in Australia at the earliest possible time".

Last night Australian Health Minister Greg Hunt announced a three month extension of the current Human Biosecurity Emergency Period, which will

#### CMV assets sale

**CRUISE** & Maritime Voyages' United Kingdom-based assets have been sold to CVI Group, a company owned by the cruise line's former Chief Executive Officer Christian Verhounig.

The assets sold include customer databases, computer systems, office furniture & equipment, intellectual property and motor vehicles.

Administrator Paul Williams of Duff & Phelps said he believed the sale gave the best value achievable for the company's creditors, and also provides Verhounig with the ability to pursue funding to "potentially relaunch CMV's unique cruise operations to its dedicated customers at some point in the future".

The emergency period has been enacted since 18 Mar this year, and until this latest update, had been slated to expire on 17 Sep.

Hunt said the extension of the emergency period is based on specialist medical and epidemiological advice provided by the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee.

He said the committee had advised that "the international and domestic COVID-19 situation continues to pose an unacceptable health risk".

"The extension of the emergency period is an appropriate response to that risk," the minister added.

The biosecurity declaration gives the government the power to take any necessary measures to prevent and control COVID-19. with current declarations in place covering restrictions on the entry of cruise ships into Australia and on overseas travel.

Despite the extension, CLIA "sees opportunity for a controlled and phased resumption of local cruise operations in Australia, with strict and enhanced health protocols in place".

"While some states may still face restrictions, there is opportunity for a future resumption in states and territories where the status of COVID-19 permits, helping to restore visitation and muchneeded economic activity," it said.
