Disney details

DISNEY Cruise Line has revealed further details about its United Kingdom sailings (CW 06 Apr).

Voyages will go on sale to the general public on 30 Apr, with Disney Magic to operate short cruises of mostly two- and three-nights, as well as some four-night sailings.

The program starts with Liverpool departures in Jul, Southampton in Aug and Newcastle and Tilbury in Sep. All sailings are round-trip cruises to nowhere, and are open only to British residents. Disney has not disclosed whether or not vaccinations

will be mandatory to cruise.

AIDA to restart in Greece from May

AIDA Cruises will offer new sailings in Greece (pictured) from May to Oct, having last month opened its 2021 season (CW 18 Feb).

Beginning 23 May, sevenday cruises will depart Corfu and travel through the islands of Greece, to Crete, Rhodes, Katakolon and Piraeus.

The cruises can also be booked as 14-day trips, with guests able to enjoy onboard amenities, including multiple restaurants, bars, cultural activities and sports facilities, as well as shore excursions to explore the ports of call.

The cruises will begin nine days after Greece reopens to tourism, with bookings on 23 dates between 23 May and 24 Oct open from tomorrow.

In addition to the new Greece cruises, AIDA will sail on sevenday voyages around the Canary




Islands through to Jun.

All cruises will be carried out in compliance with AIDA's enhanced health and safety protocols, as well as each region's applicable laws and regulations.

Guests will be subjected to a PCR test, as well as regular health checks, social distancing and hygiene protocols.

Onboard medical care will include improved testing capacities, and the AIDA promise ensures small down payments and free rebooking.

The promise is included in the travel price for new bookings up to the end of next month, and applies to departures up to 31 Mar 2022.
