## Seabourn to Australia in 2022-2023

**SEABOURN** Cruise Line has announced its 2022-2023 voyages in Australia, as well as Asia, the Caribbean, New Zealand and the Panama Canal.

The cruise line's *Seabourn Odyssey* will visit Australia and other countries throughout the Pacific Rim, with an innovative range of itineraries from seven to 35 days to be offered throughout each region.

SYDNEY party boat Seadeck has been plunged into administration under mounting debts, *The Daily Telegraph* has reported.

The \$5 million party boat was a favourite among wannabesocialite types and organised crime figures, but has stopped taking bookings, thanks to debts of up to \$14 million.

The 45-metre cruiser's fauxluxury was a favourite among shadowy figures and ne'erdo-wells, including Michael lbrahim who, according to police records, booked out the entire boat on occasion for alcohol and drug-fuelled parties.

At the heart of Seadeck's problems were infighting that resulted in legal action, and restricted trading due to pandemic-related restrictions, the administrator's report says. The boat is currently moored

at Cockatoo Island.

The Viking Explorer Sessions will showcase the cruise line's range of products, including ocean, river and expedition voyages across a one-hour session.


A dedicated expedition presentation featuring special guest speaker, polar expert David McGonigal, will offer a unique insight into Viking's expedition product, which launches in 2022.
