CELEBRITY Cruises has this morning unveiled details of its third Edge-class ship, with the company claiming the vessel will "redefine the new luxury travel experience".

Celebrity Beyond follows the design concepts of its predecessors *Celebrity Edge* and *Celebrity Apex*, but has reimagined the brand's most popular signature spaces including the exclusive The Retreat resortwithin-a-resort area for suite guests which will feature a new two-storey sundeck.

Accommodations will include double-level villas with private plunge pools, as well as staterooms with so-called "infinite verandas" which "blur the boundaries between indoor and outdoor living".

Beyond will also feature a new 50-seat fine dining restaurant in partnership with renowned



Michelin-rated chef Daniel Boulud, offering perfect wine pairings with each dish courtesy of Celebrity's "most awarded" wine collection at sea.

Other enhancements include an expanded Rooftop Garden, cantilevered float pools on the Resort Deck, a three-deck indoor Grand Plaza and the return of the Magic Carpet venue cantilevered above the sea.

Celebrity Beyond is scheduled

to depart on her maiden voyage from Southampton, England on 27 Apr 2022 on a 10-night Western Europe cruise, followed by a Mediterranean season through the Northern Summer before then heading to the Caribbean.

Ponant protocol

PONANT has confirmed Australia is excepted from its vaccination protocol (*CW* yesterday), as the cruise line's Kimberley season (*CW* 02 Mar) is restricted to Australian residents only.

Instead, local requirements will be applied in accordance with Australia's "current vaccination schedule", with a negative PCR test taken within 48 hours before boarding.

Ponant said requiring COVID vaccinations on all itineraries (apart from Australia and NZ voyages) would continue the consolidation of its anti-COVID bubble on board and provide the "best possible travel conditions".

Oceania, Regent restarts

OVERNIGHT both Regent Seven Seas Cruises and Oceania Cruises announced their highly anticipated restart plans, with sailings implemented using robust SailSAFE health and safety protocols which will be evolved and refined using the best available science and technology.

Oceania will restart in Aug, with a series of *Marina* sailings to Scandinavia and Western Europe.

The 1,250 passenger vessel will resume her originally published voyage schedule, starting on 29 Aug out of Copenhagen.

CEO Bob Binder said after the extended cruise pause "the entire Oceania Cruises team is excited to now shift our focus to safely restarting operations and ultimately welcoming back our guests to begin exploring the world once again".

The remainder of the Oceania fleet will recommence sailing in a phased program, with dates and itineraries to be revealed closer to the sailing dates.

Binder also flagged an "array of truly surprising enhancements to the brand's already acclaimed culinary experience and onboard service," under the previously announced OceaniaNEXT enhancement program.

"Our guests have been waiting a long time for this moment...when our guests return we want to not just welcome them back to the Oceania Cruises they remember and cherish, but also to exceed their expectations by elevating the dining experiences and service levels," Binder said.

MEANWHILE Regent Seven Seas Cruises has also announced its return to sailing, with the brand new *Seven Seas Splendor* set to operate out of the UK from Sep.

The voyage will mark the inaugural season for the vessel, which only completed two cruises with guests on board after its christening in Feb 2020.

Regent CEO Jason Montague said it would be a double celebration.

She will then transition to explore the Mediterranean before crossing the Atlantic to sail in the Caribbean, with a phased restart planned for the rest of the Regent Seven Seas fleet which remains suspended to 30 Sep.

Key West vote

THE bill aiming to nullify Key West's vote on reducing cruise ship berths has passed Florida's House Commerce Committee (*CW* 11 Jan).

The board voted 13-5 to back House Bill 267, which would prohibit the citizens of Key West from restricting the number of cruise ships to enter their ports.

Residents voted in Nov to limit cruise activity in their port based on the size, type or capacity of ships in the hopes of reducing the number of tourists who visit the destination (*CW* 05 Nov 2020). However one of the bill's sponsors overnight cited second thoughts about the constitutionality of undermining the local ordinances, and has now declared the bill "dead" for the current legislative session.

In partnership with local governments NCL will operate *Norwegian Epic* from Barcelona on a series of seven-night Western Mediterranean itineraries through until late Oct. *Norwegian Getaway*

will homeport from Rome (Civitavecchia) from 13 Sep until 25 Oct, operating 10- and 11-day Greek Island voyages offering up to 13 hours in each city.

A FUTURISTIC boat has

washed up in Victoria, more than two years after it was launched from Bluff, in New Zealand's South Island.

Originally sent out as part of a research mission, the vessel went off the grid, but it surfaced earlier this week in Waratah Bay.

The Saildrone was launched on an assignment to research the krill population around Antarctica, but this one went rogue, with the American firm that deployed the vessel losing track of it between Antarctica and Cape Horn.

Croisi ocean 2021/22

EUROPEAN river cruise specialist CrosiEurope has released details of itineraries on its ocean-going vessel *La Belle des Oceans* for 2021/22.

The vessel, which formerly sailed as Silversea's *Silver Discoverer*, will operate in the Canary Islands, visiting three national parks, as well as a series of round-trip voyages from Nice taking in Corsica.

The Canary Islands cruises are scheduled to commence in Oct this year, while the Corsican voyages will take place between May and Oct, CroisiEurope said.

The ship accommodates 130 passengers, with UK Sales Director John Fair saying *La Belle des Oceans* is able to offer a "good mix of off-the-beaten path and popular ports of call".


