



RSSC debuts 2023-2024 collection

Del Rio on the attack

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line Holdings Chief Executive Officer Frank Del Rio has slammed Florida's "shameful" vaccine passport ban, launching a withering attack on Governor Ron DeSantis.

Del Rio called Florida's "divisive" fight to ban vaccine passports as "beyond bizarre". "Our leadership has failed us," he declared.

"There is a state here that relies on tourism, it's the number one industry, and the top priority of the hospitality business is to keep customers safe."

Norwegian Cruise Line is operating only with vaccinated passengers and crews.

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

Great news from Norwegian too - with *Norwegian Gem's* first departure a few days back, the line became the first to sail from Florida with fully vaccinated passengers and crew.

This continues their restart plans which already commenced in Europe and celebrates the first departure from their new terminal in Port Miami.

Vaccinations continue to remain our focus in Australia so we can mirror this restart we are seeing overseas.

We strongly support the new campaigns which have been launched recently to encourage Australians to get vaccinated.
