### RCI Ovation canx

WITH no clear pathway for the return of foreign-flagged ships and cruising in general, Royal Caribbean International has made the decision to cancel all sailings on *Ovation of the Seas* from Sydney this season.

Cancellations span from 13 Dec through to the end of Mar.

“As Australia opens up, we are committed to progressing the proactive conversations with federal and state governments on recommencing cruising in Australia and hope to provide an update soon,” Royal Caribbean said, noting it regrets the inconvenience caused to guests.

## Viking Saturn to make debut in 2023

VIKING has announced its newest ocean ship *Viking Saturn* (render pictured) will debut in 2023, sailing three new cruises.

The 930-guest *Saturn* will spend her maiden season sailing three new itineraries in the Scandinavian and Nordic countries, including two 15-day journeys, Iconic Iceland, Greenland & Canada, and Iceland & Norway’s Arctic Explorer, and a 29-day Greenland, Iceland, Norway & Beyond voyage.

*Saturn*’s inaugural season will also see the return of the popular eight-day Iceland’s Natural Beauty itinerary, starting in Aug 2023.

“The thousands of guests who sailed our Welcome Back voyage in Iceland this past summer enjoyed the experience so much they provided record-level ratings,” said, Chair Torstein Hagen.

“These new itineraries are



ideal for curious travellers and trace routes of the early Viking explorers to Iceland and other North Atlantic destinations known for their natural beauty.

“We look forward to welcoming *Viking Saturn* to our fleet and to offering guests even more ways

to explore this unique part of the world in comfort.”

*Saturn* will feature all veranda staterooms, Explorer suites, two pool choices, a LivNordic Spa, Explorers’ Lounge cocktail bar, Mamsaen’s deli, eight dining options and more.

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## Windstar Star Plus initiative complete

**WINDSTAR** Cruises has taken delivery of *Star Pride* in Palermo, marking the completion of the USD\$250 million Star Plus initiative renovation project.

The third and final all-suite Star Plus Class yacht to emerge from her multi-year, modernisation, *Pride* will remain in Italy until she resumes guest operations in Apr in the Mediterranean.

“We are thrilled to have all three of our yachts completely reimagined, from the new, more environmentally-friendly engines to the gorgeous new restaurant spaces, spacious suites, and romantic spas,” said President Christopher Prelog.

The renovation saw *Pride* stretched, and increased in maximum capacity from 212 passengers to 312.

*Pride* will provide additional dining, including an outdoor barbecue concept with grilling guru Steven Raichlen, and a Spanish small plates restaurant from Anthony Sasso.

The ship will also supply a true spa and fitness centre, an elegant infinity pool, and more outdoor deck areas.

In addition, all of Windstar’s yachts’ HVAC systems have been updated, adding new hospital grade high-efficiency particulate filters along with a UV-C air-zapping process to clean the air on board.
