
Middleton said his team was also keen to dispel misconceptions about river cruising, such as its price point and demographic.

**BRISBANE** International Cruise Terminal has received its first call - but sadly, it was not a cruise ship.

The Australian Navy's Choules docked in Brisbane just before midday on Fri, and left yesterday.

The first ship into the \$177 million cruise terminal should have been P&O Cruises Australia's Pacific Dawn, which was originally scheduled to call on 03 Oct 2020.

Instead of arriving to rapturous fanfare, Choules docked to only a small handful of onlookers, including a few family members and a number of slightly bemused security quards.

Speaking of the reception, those there to collect their family members were guizzed on the new terminal.

"Yes, it's quite okay," one patron told The Brisbane Times.

"I didn't even know it was here."

## A wheely bad year



WHEN cruising in Queensland was on a record growth trajectory, family run Kangaroo Bus Lines acquired 10 luxury coaches to specifically cater for the cruise market.

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit and cruising was suspended, Kangaroo's business fell by about 30%.

Following the significant hit to his business, Kangaroo Chief **Executive Officer Darren Webster** (pictured) is backing calls for federal and state governments to engage with cruising and agree to a pathway for domestic sailing to resume.

The coaches, each valued at around \$550,000, were obtained over a three-year period, with Webster saying it was nothing for Kangaroo to have had up to 30 per day devoted to a Brisbane call by a cruise ship.

"It was a substantial investment and included a couple of custombuilt stepless vehicles to cater for the elderly and people with disabilities... there was also the investment in ground staff and training to make them seamlessly part of the cruise line's brand,"

"The buses did a mixture of shore excursions to places such as Australia Zoo and other attractions in Brisbane and its immediate surrounds, through to shuttle bus services.

"We invested heavily in capital to support cruise operations and even though the ships are no longer here, the capital still is."

Webster said there was often a reference to "we are all in this together" but there was little recognition tourism-connected businesses such as his were haemorrhaging money at an alarming rate each day.

### MSC new payment

MSC Cruises has announced two new payment options for travel partners in Australia.

Effective yesterday, MSC is accepting payment from both the TravelPay and Mint platforms, in addition to the option of direct bank transfer.

The move comes due to the closure of the eNett system, which is no longer available.

Meanwhile, MSC's cruise of the month for Sep is a grand voyage from Dubai to Genoa.

MSC is offering savings of up to \$726 per person for this month on the 18-night cruise on board MSC Europa, departing Dubai 25 Mar 2023.

The itinerary will sail through the Suez Canal, visiting Abu Dhabi, Sir Bani Yas, Jeddah, Naples, and Rome.

The deal, with included Easy Plus drinks package is priced from \$2,369 per person, and bookings must be made by the end of the month.

### Santa says no

**SANTA** Barbara has suspended cruise ship visits until Mar 2022.

City of Santa Barbara Waterfront Director Mike Wiltshire said the decision was a really tough one, given the big role cruise ships play in the community.

It comes following a COVID-19 outbreak aboard a Carnival cruise out of Texas.

Wiltshire said Monterey is also suspending its visits. but he believes Catalina will continue to allow calls.





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
