WA back on board

THIS week's news WA will begin a resumption of cruising in time for the upcoming Kimberley season is an important victory for our industry and represents a key piece of the pie when it comes to Australia's cruising revival.

The state's decision to allow ships with up to 350 people on board after 17 Apr means international expedition cruise operators will be able to join local counterparts in helping to rebuild cruise across the northwest.

When combined with the NT's earlier decision to allow ships of the same capacity, it means both sides of Australia's important Kimberley region will be open to expedition cruises throughout this year's season.

WA will also plan for the return of larger cruise ships from Oct, allowing it to join the cruise revival already planned on the east coast and restoring Fremantle's status as a key cruising gateway on the west

CLIA's expedition and small-ship cruise line members have been integral to this success in WA.

Together with the phenomenal support we've received from travel agents and other industry backers, this has helped achieve a breakthrough that will allow Australia to begin a national cruise recovery.



P&O's Iona set to launch

THE United Kingdom's P&O Cruises' Iona will set sail for the Norwegian fjords on her maiden season on Sat.
