Victoria releases cruise protocols

ALL passengers cruising to and from Victoria over 12 must have received two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, and must also obtain a negative COVID test before embarking, under restrictions implemented by the state's government this week.

Unvaccinated children under 12 or anyone with a valid medical exemption can travel, but they must not make up more than 5% of the ship's passengers.

Guests with COVID-19 symptoms may board a ship, but they must return another negative PCR test.

Passengers must also wear masks when embarking and disembarking, as well as while indoors on board the ship, if social distancing is not possible.

Crew members will need to have received three doses (with exceptions for those who aren't yet eligible), and will receive



a COVID test every 14 days, or when symptomatic.

They must also be masked on board at all times, except when in their staterooms.

Requirements for entry to Victoria for crews will be the same as those for aircrews.

MEANWHILE, cruise lines must undertake public health measures to reduce the risk of COVID transmission, including developing COVIDSafe plans for shore excursions, and managing cases and contacts onboard; however, these protocols will not apply to vessels with fewer than 100 passengers.

"The return of cruise ships later this year is great news for our visitor economy, and our COVIDSafe protocols will protect workers, passengers, and the communities and attractions that will host cruise ship excursions," said Health Minister Martin Foley.

AN ABANDONED "eyesore" boat in the Chicago River remains stuck, six months after officials began investigating it.

The boat is overturned and grounded near the 2800 block of W Giddings Street.

She used to be tied up, and in decent condition, but she has since flipped.

"It's bizarre we have this intrusion in the river and no one is taking care of it," one of the boat's neighbours told Book Club Chicago, which has been reporting on the situation.

"I don't want to live with it, it's like garbage, it's a local curiosity at this point."

A resident first called 3-1-1 about the boat in Sep, and the community has spoken to "at least five or six government agencies" about getting it removed, but the boat remains.

Arcadia cancelled

A CREW shortage has caused the United Kingdom's P&O Cruises to cancel sailings aboard Arcadia.

Seven cruises have been cancelled, with the ship to idle until 05 Jul.

"The current and extraordinary impact of COVID-19 in the UK, in the wider hospitality, service and airline industry as a whole has resulted in a temporary disruption to crewmembers available to join our ships," P&O said.

AIDAcosma christened



FORMER German track cyclist Kristina Vogel has christened AIDA Cruises' AIDAcosma in Hamburg.

The ship was christened on the weekend under the motto "the world is becoming more colourful", with an accompanying music and light show to endorse the maxim.

Accompanied by Captain Vincent Cofalka, the godmother of AIDA's second liquified natural gas cruise ship lit up a colourful globe on the Ocean Deck of AIDAcosma as the baptismal bottle smashed against the hull of the vessel.

Cruise fans followed the christening live on the AIDA YouTube channel, and on board all of the cruise line's ships.

DJ Alle Farben was a guest of the evening, delighting the approximately 350 invited guests and 3,300 passengers of the subsequent christening cruise with an exclusive concert in the Theatrium of AIDAcosma.

Other star guests on board were German comedian Ingo Appelt, and DJ Mockaby, who performed at the AIDAcosma Beach Club on the night of the christening.

At around 11:30pm, AIDAcosma said goodbye to Hamburg with a light show from on board, which took place during the departure while passing Hamburg monuments the Elbphilharmonie and the Landungsbrucken.

The two-week christening voyage will sail to Palma over the Easter holidays, until 23 Apr.

Afterward, AIDAcosma will offer voyages from Palma and Barcelona, with Florence, Rome, and Corsica also on the program.

From Autumn, AIDAcosma will set course for Dubai, its home for the northern winter.
