Canada hails environmental progress

CRUISE ships have been successfully implementing strict new environmental measures for wastewater imposed by Transport Canada earlier this year, with the first reporting period showing "significant progress towards reducing the environmental impacts of cruise ships and other vessels on the water".

The regulations were announced in Apr as part of the Canadian cruise restart, aiming to mitigate marine pollution with the return of the industry.

"Out of 47 cruise ships to enter Canadian waters this year, only one vessel was unable to fully implement the new measures, as a result of geographical/technical limitations and for safety reasons," a statement from the Canadian Government noted.

The overall total included 35 cruise ship visits to Canada's Pacific Coast, 12 on the Atlantic



side of the country and four in Canada's Great Lakes region.

The requirements govern the type of wastewater discharges permitted at certain distances from shore, as well as governing how water is treated prior to its discharge further out to sea.

As part of the new suite of environmental measures the cruise industry is required to document and report activity to Transport Canada, while compliance with the enhanced

requirements is also verified during formal ship inspections.

The strict measures, which exceed international standards, "will continue to help keep our waters and our environment clean," the statement added.

Canada is also planning to add further requirements for areas of concern, including scrubber discharges that release acidic wastewater into the ocean.

Canadian Transport Minister, Omar Alghabra (**pictured**), said "cruise ships are an important part of our economy and tourism sector and we must all work together to reduce their impact on the environment, and keep our waters safe and clean for everyone".

"These new environmental measures are a first step towards making shipping cleaner and protecting our waters from coast to coast to coast," he added.

Quick cruise profit

A FORMER Holland America cruise ship which was sold for US\$10 million in the early stages of the pandemic has just been traded again - but this time with a US\$30 million price tag.

The MS Maasdam was purchased back in Jul 2020 by Greek shipping billionaire Marios Iliopoulos who owns high speed island-hopping ferry company Seajets.

It's understood the latest owner of the ship is a French start-up cruise line called Compagnie Francaise De Crosieres (CFC), which was registered earlier this year.

Corporate records indicate that CFC is led by Clement Mousset, who was formerly GM for France at Cruise & Maritime Voyages, which collapsed just over two years ago (*CW* 21 Jul 2020)

Devonport revamp

TASPORTS has awarded a major contract for work to revamp the Port of Devonport to a local Tasmanian firm.

The Devonport East Quaylink project will deliver a new berth, a new wharf structure and reclamation of an area near the existing Berth 3E, which will be specifically designed for the new Spirit of Tasmania Bass Strait vessels.

A joint venture company established by Hazell Bros Group and Brady Marine & Civil will undertake work on the eastern side of the Mersey River, with the Tasmanian Government saying the awarding of the initial contract is a "great milestone for the project and the port".

Crystal sales chief

FORMER Silversea Cruises VP of Passenger Services and Consumer Sales, Mattias Lira, has joined the reborn Crystal Cruises as Senior VP of Global Sales & Guest Services.

Lira will be based in the company's Miami office and report to CEO Jack Anderson who has returned to Crystal under its Abercrombie & Kent rebirth (CW 28 Jul).

Anderson said Lira "appreciates the incredible value of travel advisors and will build strong relationships, working with reservations and sales support to keep the focus on guest satisfaction".

Other recent Crystal appointments include former NCLH staffer Lee Quittner as Head of Consumer Sales.



Coral Expeditions East Indies



CORAL Expeditions has announced a unique threevoyage series taking in the "island trails of the East Indies" including Komodo, Sulawesi and Borneo.
