

MURRAY River paddlesteamer Canally has made her first voyage in 81 years, heading from Morgan to Mannum in South Australia.

The vessel was used to trade dried fruits between Berri and Morgan before being put to work on the construction of the lock and weir system on the Murray in the early 1920s.

After changing hands and locations in the following years, Canally was left at a mooring at Boundary Bend in Victoria and eventually sank.

Canally was raised back in 1998, and her restoration began in 2010

Sun hit an iceberg

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line's Norwegian Sun made contact with a growler - an iceberg less than two metres across - while transiting to Hubbard Glacier in Alaska on the weekend.

The cruise line said after the incident, Sun sailed to Juneau for further assessment, where it was decided that her present voyage would be shortened.

Sun was then given clearance by the United States Coast Guard and other local maritime authorities to return to Seattle at reduced speed.

All guests currently onboard will disembark in Seattle as originally planned, and Norwegian is communicating with all impacted passengers.
