NZ cruise ban set to ease

AUTHORITIES in New Zealand have hinted that the country's maritime border restrictions will be lifted in line with yesterday's announcement about the reopening of the country to foreign tourists from next month.

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern confirmed that the planned Jul reopening date for vaccinated Australians was being brought forward to 11.59pm on 12 Apr, while tourists from visa waiver partner countries will once again be able to enter New Zealand from 11.59pm on 01 May, with no isolation or quarantine requirements.

During a media conference announcing the changes, Ardern was asked about cruise, and she said "that's something we actively have a work program on right now, how to ensure that we have consistency with these decisions today for our maritime border,



including for cruise ships".

"We will see the return of cruise ships...we haven't made those alterations formally the border here today...extra work that we need to go through but we are expecting of course to bring forward the reopening for those borders as well."

However Ardern wasn't able to provide an estimated timeline for the return, flagging a further update as protocols are finalised.
