### Hurtigruten takes Galapagos stake

HURTIGRUTEN has announced it has taken a 24.9% shareholding in Ecuador-based Metropolitan Touring - a business which it has a long-term regional partnership with.

Group Chief Executive Officer Daniel Skjeldam said the deal was a "unique opportunity for us to contribute to a more meaningful partnership, where we can expand quickly, strategically and deliver on our vision for the future together".

The current partnership sees the two companies operate the 90-passenger Santa Cruz II in the Galapagos, with Hurtigruten more than doubling its capacity in the region (CW 15 Dec 2021) to now offer year round itineraries in 2023 and 2024, with pre- and post- tours.

# Fuel charges hit cruise

**TWO** European cruise lines have introduced fuel supplements as the 2021–2022 global energy crisis begins to hit the cruise industry.

Celestyal Cruises will charge an additional AUD\$11 per person per day on all bookings made and deposited from Apr for sailings departing from 18 Apr "until further notice."

"We are disappointed that we have had to make this decision but [it] is necessary under current circumstances," read an email sent to travel partners, and seen by *Cruise Weekly*.

"In view of this, please ensure we receive names and deposits for all existing bookings by latest 31 Mar 2022."

"Celestyal Cruises commits itself to return to its guests this supplement in the form of onboard credit, should there be a downward adjustment or elimination of the supplement in the two weeks preceding the guests sailing date."

The cruise line said it will continue to monitor global fuel prices closely and act accordingly.

Meanwhile, river cruise line CroisiEurope said it is charging a "small amount."

The two cruise lines join Adventure Canada, which last week said it had been "left with no choice" but to implement a USD\$44 per person per day surcharge for its upcoming 2022 and 2023 expeditions (*CW* 22 Mar).

The last time fuel surcharges hit the cruise industry was when oil prices spiked over USD\$100 a barrel in 2007-08.

At the time, major brands such as Royal Caribbean International and Carnival Cruise Line added fuel surcharges of USD\$5 to USD\$10 per person per day.
