Masks back on Carnival Corp ships

CARNIVAL Corporation has reintroduced masks for passengers on board all of its brands, after a recent spike in COVID-19 cases in Australia.

Months after the mandate was scrapped, Carnival told *Travel Daily* the health measure has returned "as an additional safeguard in light of the current rate of COVID-19 in the general community".

Masks are now required on board in all public indoor spaces, outdoors when in large groups where physical distancing cannot be secured, and when on transfers, such as tenders and buses.

Seascape delivered to MSC

MSC Cruises has taken delivery of its new flagship *MSC Seascape*, just a week after the naming ceremony of *MSC World Europa*. *Seascape* is the second new cruise ship to join MSC this year, bringing the fleet to 21 ships.

The ship is the second Seaside EVO class ship to enter MSC's fleet, and the fourth in the cruise line's Seaside-class, which is specifically designed for the Caribbean.

The new flagship will feature extensive outdoor spaces and some of the latest environmental technologies currently available at sea.

Seascape is the largest cruise ship to be built in Italy, with the delivery taking place in the presence of MSC Group founder and Executive Chair Gianluigi Aponte.

Also present at the ceremony were MSC Cruises Executive

Chair Pierfrancesco Vago, Fincantieri Chief Executive Officer Pierroberto Folgiero, as well as other regional and local authorities, dignitaries, travel advisor partners and media.

During the ceremony, Shipyard Director Cristiano Bazzara presented to Captain Roberto Leotta an ampoule containing the water that first touched the hull when *Seascape* was floated out earlier this year.

Following her naming ceremony in NYC on 07 Dec, *Seascape* will sail to Miami for her inaugural season in the Caribbean.

Seascape will offer two different seven-night itineraries from Miami: an Eastern Caribbean cruise, calling at Ocean Cay MSC Marine Reserve, Nassau, San Juan, and Puerto Plata; and a Western Caribbean sailing, calling at Ocean Cay, Cozumel, George Town, and Ocho Rios.

RCI sets 2024 European season



A LINE-UP of seven ships in nine homeports has been set for Royal Caribbean International's 2024 European adventures.

The season will see vacationers experience a wide variety of cruises which range from five to 17 nights, and explore culturerich locales, including Reykjavik, Ephesus, the Arctic Circle, Rome, and the Greek Isles.

The program will include the continental debut of the amplified Oasis of the Seas (pictured), which will open the program with a splash in May 2024, sailing from Barcelona and Rome.

For the first time, Oasis vacationers can explore the Western Mediterranean on seven-night Spain, France & Italy cruises from Barcelona and Rome to bucket-list destinations like Palma de Mallorca, Florence, and Provence.

Odyssey of the Seas and Anthem of the Seas will

return to sail from Rome and Southampton respectively. For the third year running, Odyssey vacationers will be whisked away on their choice of seven- to nine-night Greek Isles cruises from Rome to destinations like Naples, the Greek Isles of Santorini and Crete, and 12-night Holy Land sailings to Limassol, Ephesus, Jerusalem, and more.

Anthem will call Southampton home for the fourth consecutive year, with cruisers able to choose from seven-night adventures to Spain and France or the fjords of Norway, discovering destinations like Maloy, Haugesund, and Bilbao. Longer, 11- to 14-night

vacations will visit spots such as Lisbon, Vigo, and the Canarys.

Rounding out the summer line-up are Explorer of the Seas, Voyager of the Seas, Jewel of the Seas, and an Ultimate World Cruise on Serenade of the Seas.

"DON'T eat dead whales". That's the main theme of a special advisory issued by Fisheries & Oceans Canada, after several of the giant aquatic mammals washed up on the shores of British Columbia recently.

The urgent notice follows some "severe illness" reported in several dogs which apparently ingested whale meat from a decaying carcass in Masset Inlet, a large salt water bay on the region's Haida Gwaii archipelago.

"Apart from the concerns around botulism in the dead whale carcass that make it unfit for consumption. marine mammal meat and blubber can also contain high levels of toxins and heavy metals," according to an update from Fishery Officer Chase Edwards.

The notice urges anyone who has snacked on the dead giants of the sea to urgently inform the Department - while also warning people to keep their distance from the bodies.

"Especially in a place like this, lots of school groups, tourists and people like to go check it out, so we just want people to be aware that looking and taking photos is probably the best option, instead of playing with it or taking pieces or parts of it," the update added.

Dog owners have also been told to keep their pets leashed.

Minister of Tourism Randall Mitchell said Royal Caribbean's Rhapsody of the Seas will mark the cruise line's return to the dual-island Caribbean nation, following diligent works between the government and the brand.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Royal Caribbean came to Trinidad & Tobago to drop off employees from the country returning home.

RCI's call will precede another cruise visit from MSC Cruises later this month.

"We look forward to welcoming the cruise lines," Mitchell told local media.

"We look forward to a very good cruise season."

Cunard Canada partnership


