**EXPERTS** have created a 3D model to solve the puzzle of a sunken German U-boat from World War I.

The Scottish experts have found submarine *UC-71* is likely to have been sunk deliberately rather than being handed to the Allies.

The Dundee University team said the submarine was apparently scuttled off the small German archipelago of Heligoland in Feb 1919.

The official reason for the sinking is bad weather and high waves, although theories abound she was sunk by her own crew, as the hatches had been opened.

During four-hour-long dives, the team took thousands of photographs using state-of-the art cameras and high-intensity lighting, and have concluded the 3D map created from the images prove the boat was scuttled by its own crew.

### Viking opens 2026

VIKING has opened reservations for its 2026 European river cruise program, with the early release following strong demand.

Many 2024 dates are already sold out, and the 2025 season is selling well, with all 2026 departures now available for booking across the current 80-strong river ship fleet.

## Princess' Star is born

**PRINCESS** Cruises' new Star Princess has begun the countdown to her debut in the Mediterranean in summer 2025, with the traditional keel laying ceremony recently taking place at the Fincantieri shipyard.

The cruise line's second Sphereclass ship was then traditionally blessed, beginning the first of the more than two million man hours which will go into building her.

The ceremony saw executives from the cruise line and Fincantieri weld a Princess Medallion into *Star* which is believed to bring good luck to the ship and all who sail on her.

"Our multi-decade shipbuilding collaboration continues to progress as we build spectacular ships that are enabled by the most advanced technology available while infusing magnificent Italian craftsmanship and respecting beautiful Princess design heritage," the cruise line's President John Padgett said.

Star joins her sister ship Sun Princess as the largest ships ever built for the cruise line, carrying 4,300 guests.

The new ship will be the second in the Princess fleet to be powered by LNG fuel technology and also is being built with the most advanced sustainable innovations available.

**MEANWHILE**, Princess also announced *Star* will join *Sun* in the Caribbean in 2025-26, as part of the cruise line's largest Americas season ever.

Princess' two newest ships will sail from Fort Lauderdale, offering a range of eastern and western Caribbean itineraries. Almost 300 cruises, which will go on sale on 20 Dec, will depart from seven home ports to the Caribbean, the Panama Canal, Mexico, Hawaii, Tahiti, and Coastal California.

The season will also see *Sky Princess* become the first Royalclass ship to home port in Port Canaveral, offering six-to-eightday Caribbean cruises.

There will also be a celebratory Mexican Riviera cruise aboard *Royal Princess*, a nostalgic throwback marking the 60th anniversary of the very first Princess sailing, which voyaged on *Princess Patricia* in Dec 1965.

"Sun Princess and Star Princess will deliver epic vacations and magnify the beauty of the Caribbean by offering guests the most celebrated views and vantage points available of the islands' crystal blue waters and exotic charm," Chief Commercial Officer Terry Thornton said.
