CUNARD Line has announced 50 exclusive *Queen Anne* shore experiences for next year.

The ship is set to arrive in Australia on Sat for her second season, following her hugely successful maiden year last summer (**CW** 21 Dec 2022).

The four-month season includes a series of eight trans-Tasman voyages calling on iconic cities and coastal towns.

Spirit has been adorned with decorations and music playing in all public areas in anticipation of Christmas, with an enchanting Xmas village in the Atrium (**pictured**) created by the Executive Chef and their team.

GALVESTON gave a Texassized welcome to its newest ship, Carnival Cruise Line's *Carnival Jubilee*, this week.

The new vessel is the first to ever debut from Galveston, and is fittingly doing so with a Texas Star on her bow.

Jubilee was welcomed with a grand water salute as she docked in Galveston for the first time, signalling the start of a significant expansion strategy in Galveston.

The island city has grown among Carnival's top home ports since the cruise line became the first to operate from it year-round more than two decades ago.

Jubilee joins Carnival Breeze and Carnival Dream at the port as part of a four-ship deployment plan (**CW** 26 Sep), which will also see Carnival Miracle reposition to Galveston next autumn.

"The Texas star on her bow isn't just decoration, it's a symbol of our gratitude to our guests sailing from Texas who've made us the number one cruise line in Galveston, and our commitment to the future of cruising from this great city and state," President Christine Duffy said.

BA terminal change

OFFICIALS at the Terminal de Cruceros Quinquela Martin in Buenos Aires have developed a new check-in process after a recent storm damaged the cruise facility.

The squall collapsed the terminal's roof onto the waiting and pre-boarding area, with the new process having begun on Tue, and will be in place until at least Mar while the facility undergoes repairs.

The change will only affect embarking passengers, with transit calls not impacted.

The kings of Antarctica



QUARK Expeditions has successfully landed more than 200 explorers from two voyages on Snow Hill Island off the east coast of the Antarctic Peninsula to visit its remote colony of emperor penguins.

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The team aboard Quark's Ultramarine delivered these successful voyages over the past two months, which saw small groups fly in the ship's Airbus H-145 helicopters to a staging site, at a significant distance from the 'huddle'.

Every guest then walked several kilometres over sea ice to reach the colony (**pictured**).

Quark also recently hosted a special onboard ceremony at the edge of Antarctica's Weddell Sea, at which commercial astronaut Sian Proctor was officially confirmed as *Ultramarine's* godmother (*CW* 08 Jun).

"We may not be able to voyage off the planet, as Dr Proctor has done, but we will always go together with our polar explorers to find life-changing experiences at its farthest edges," President Andrew White said.

"My goal as an astronaut and an artist is to inspire," Proctor said.

"I am so honored to be godmother for *Ultramarine* - a role that will allow me to lead by example and to share the personal stories that will inspire others to go out into the world, to experience something new and to become, in their own amazing way, part of the next generation of explorers." *MS*
