## Viking announces 24/25 world cruises

VIKING has announced details of is World Cruise itineraries in 2024-2025, including the full 180-day 'Viking World Voyage I', which will visit 37 countries and 85 ports, with overnight stays in 13 key cities.

The Viking Sky voyage will depart Fort Lauderdale on 19 Dec 2024 and circumnavigate the globe, returning to the United States for its final port in New York City on 17 Jun the following year.

Guests can also choose the shorter 163-day Viking World Voyage II portion of the journey (from Los Angeles to New York City), or the 138-day Viking World Cruise itinerary (from Fort Lauderdale to London).

Launch deals available for bookings made before 31 Mar include Business class air, ground transfers, all onboard gratuities and service fees, complimentary visa services and a beverage package.

All World Cruise guests also receive a AUD\$2,800pp shorex credit plus AUD\$1,400pp for onboard spending - call 138 747 (AU) or 0800 447 913 (NZ).

### RSSC Explorer's brief NZ debut



**THE** triumphant maiden visit of Regent Seven Seas Cruises' (RSSC) Seven Seas Explorer to New Zealand (pictured) has been somewhat tempered by a lastminute move from authorities who have ordered that the ship return to international waters for more work to clean its hull.

Explorer was welcomed by a water salute on her inaugural arrival to Auckland vesterday morning - but later in the day guests were advised the ship would be returning to international waters, and the first port of call, in the Bay of Islands, had been cancelled.

Guests on board have confirmed via social media they are currently sitting about 31 nautical miles off Tauranga, posting that

"apparently the hull cleaning conducted last week was a failure".

The biosecurity issue for ships visiting New Zealand has plagued several cruise ships this season, including Princess Cruises' Coral Princess, Viking's Orion and Cunard's Queen Elizabeth, all of which have been forced to modify itineraries in order to satisfy New Zealand officials (CW 10 Jan).

Despite the ructions, those on board are being well catered for on the "most luxurious ship ever built". with RSSC also this week launching its Upgrade Your Horizon offers of suite upgrades, savings of up to 40% and reduced deposits across sailings through to 2025 - for more details see rssc.com/specials.

### Pandaw adds new India cruise itinerary

PANDAW has introduced a new India short cruise exploring West Bengal, taking in a number of key highlights of the Ganges.

Travellers will visit former European colonies, finely decorated Hindu temples, rural villages, and centres of traditional craftmanship, with a highlight the Hazarduari Palace.

The cruise includes calls at destinations such as

Matiari, Kalna, Barrackpore, Baranagar, Ajimganj, Mayapur, Chandernagore, and Hooghly, depending on upstream or downstream travel.

The 'Exploring West Bengal' cruise from Kolkata to Murshidabad travels for three or four nights from USD\$1,440 per person, inclusive of a one-way First class train ticket between Kolkata and Murshidabad.
