Nova christened

SILVERSEA Cruises officially named Silver Nova in Fort Lauderdale earlier this week, announcing chef Nina Compton as godmother.

Esteemed guests embarked Nova yesterday, honouring the milestone during the ship's maiden call in Florida.

Reverend Sanford Sears and Rabbi Adam Watstein blessed Nova, while President Barbara Muckermann, and Jason Liberty, President & Chief Executive Officer of Royal Caribbean Group, addressed the ceremony.

"We are all incredibly proud to officially welcome Silver Nova into Royal Caribbean Group's fleet," Liberty said.

Aussie cruise set for a bumper year

CRUISE Lines International Association (CLIA) Managing Director Joel Katz (pictured) said this year was likely to be one of Australia's busiest for cruise tourism, with lines making significant capacity increases in deployments for 2024.

He said cruise lines have boosted their Australian presence, offering more local ships, more sailings, and more staterooms than ever before.

This year will see 81 cruise ships operating in Australian waters, which is 14% more than last year.

The result is a wealth of options for cruise fans and enormous economic potential for communities around the coast.

"Many of these ships will be staying longer and offering more local sailings, which means Australia will welcome more than 3,700 port calls around the country - an 18% increase over



last year," Katz said.

"The total cruise passenger capacity in Australia this year will be up by 42% over 2023, which reflects the huge passion Australians have for cruising and the strong overseas interest in sailing Down Under.

"Cruising delivered a record economic impact worth \$5.6

billion to the national economy last financial year, and all signs suggest cruise tourism will continue to be enormously valuable to Australia throughout 2024 and well beyond."

CLIA cruise lines are preparing to welcome nine ships over the year ahead, having launched 13 in 2023.

"The incoming fleet of new ocean ships illustrates the huge diversity of cruising styles available to today's traveller around the world," Katz added.

"This year's launches include a mix of contemporary ships, luxury ships and expedition ships, from an equally broad range of cruise lines...together these ships will be among the most advanced and energy-efficient ships to have ever sailed, and the choices they offer demonstrate why there is a cruising style to suit almost any taste." The English chef will bring Le Gavroche to guests on Queen Anne and Queen Mary 2 from Jun, following the closure of his iconic London restaurant later this month.
