MSC adds Starlink

MSC Cruises' fleet is being boosted with Starlink, with two-thirds of the line's ships now equipped with the onboard connectivity.

The fleet roll-out program will be completed by May, with Starlink to provide faster internet speeds, improved wi-fi in staterooms and public spaces, reduced latency levels, and lower operational costs.

The first MSC vessel to be equipped with Starlink was MSC Magnifica in Dec 2022, with the cruise line seeing bandwidth consumption continue to rise, driven by the increase in the number of devices connected.

Sun rises on new era for Princess

PRINCESS Cruises' "next-level" new ship Sun Princess (pictured) has debuted on her maiden voyage to the Mediterranean.

The 4,300-guest ship officially started her inaugural season on a 10-day Grand Mediterranean cruise round trip from Rome, taking guests to Naples, Crete, Kusadasi, Athens, Sicily, Mallorca, and Barcelona.

Sun debuts new eye-catching venues including The Dome, a geodesic, glass-enclosed structure at the top of the ship inspired by the terraces of Santorini.

"This is an historic day as our new Sun Princess sets sail on her inaugural voyage, and our guests get to experience our sensational, next-level, Love Boat first-hand," President John Padgett said.

"The ship is a magnificent showcase of advanced design, technology and craftsmanship, with elevated spaces and



experiences all focused on taking the Princess vacation experience to a new level."

The outward and suspended Sphere Atrium, the namesake of this new class of ship, takes Sun's central Piazza hub into a new dimension, enveloping guests with expansive ocean views and inspired to deliver the desired lifestyle of relaxed indoor and

outdoor living.

Sun's reimagined staterooms include new Cabana Mini-Suites with extra space for secluded outdoor relaxation.

The ship is also Princess' first LNG vessel, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and featuring ingenious energy recovery systems for eco-conscious cruising. MS

At the launch of the 2024

When asked directly by *Cruise Weekly*, a spokesperson added,

"since Taiwan reopened its ports to cruise ships on 24 Oct, 2022, there has been a significant rebound in international routes, and the number of cruise ship visits to Taiwan in 2023 has recovered to 50% of the prepandemic level in 2019, and it is estimated to reach 70% by 2024".
