Evergreen rebrand

Viking's new Egypt ship floats out

VIKING has marked the floatout of its newest Egypt ship, Viking Hathor (pictured), which is set to debut later this year.

The newest ship for the Nile is set to expand Viking's fleet on the river, with Hathor recently touching water for the first time.

The traditional float-out ceremony took place at Massara shipyard in Cairo, and denotes Hathor moving into its final stage of her construction.

She will now be moved to a nearby outfitting dock for her final construction and interior build-out.

Hathor is an identical sister to the cruise line's other Nile vessels Viking Osiris and Viking Aton, and will sail the popular 12-day Pharaohs & Pyramids itinerary.

"Egypt is a phenomenal destination, and we are pleased with the continued interest in our Nile River voyages," Viking Chair



Torstein Hagen said.

"Our guests are thinking people who are curious about the world - and Egypt, with its cultural treasures and ancient antiquities - remains at the top of the travel list for many of them.

"With the float-out of Viking Hathor, we look forward to welcoming more guests to

experience this fantastic region."

Viking will have six ships sailing the Nile by next year, with the addition of another sister, Viking Sobek, which is already under construction, and will be delivered in 2025.

Additional ships in the Egypt fleet currently include Viking Ra and Antares. MS

ANTARCTICA'S "penguin post office" has a number of openings, with the United Kingdom's Antarctic Heritage Trust advertising three opportunities available at its location in Port Lockroy.

The roles include a base leader, a general assistant, and a shop manager, however you have to be British to apply.

Successful applicants will live and work together for five months beginning in Nov, sorting the 80,000 letters and postcards the office receives.

They will also sell postage stamps, care for the 80-yearold weathered buildings, and run the on-site gift shop.

The role also involves counting the 1,500 gentoo penguins which nest around Port Lockroy, which could prove difficult given they're all dressed the same.

MSC content rules

MSC Cruises is set to work together with 'Cruise with Ben and David' to craft a new policy for content creators on board its ships.

The two cruise vloggers were recently told they were not allowed to film on board MSC World Europa - an incident which the line apologised for.

MSC said it is also rolling out new crew training governing the space.

"It's a great opportunity to get together with other CLIA travel agents and learn about the latest initiatives in cruising, direct from the cruise lines," Director



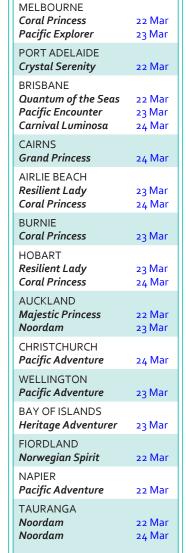
Nosic said.
