More ports and short cruises for P&O

P&O will visit two new Australian ports and double the range of short cruises in 2012-13.

KANGAROO ISLAND AND PORT LINCOLN HAVE BEEN added to P&O's new program, which opens for sale on 31 Mar.

Pacific Sun will make maiden calls to the two SA destinations on a coastal cruise from Fremantle to Sydney.

The program also features 24 "short breaks" of less than a week, including more of the popular comedy and food/winethemed cruises.

A record total of 126 voyages are on offer, between Jun 2012 and Apr 2013, with fares starting at \$749pp (guad share) for a sevennight cruise from Brisbane and \$1199 for a



Sister ship Costa Fascinosa is due for delivery in mid-2012, bringing the fleet to 16.

The line forecasts around 9.5 million passenger movements for next year.

Royal Princess on her way

THIS WEEK MARKS THE FIRST CONSTRUCTION WORK to take place for Princess Cruises newest ship, Royal Princess.

Special teasers provided by Princess yesterday have shed some light on what the industry should expect from the first of two new-generation ships.

The 141,000 ton Royal Princess will feature capacity for 3,600 passengers, and new design concepts include an over-water SeaWalk, which will essentially be a top deck glass bottomed walkway which will extend 28 feet beyond the vessel on her starboard side.

In addition, passengers can expect a similarly cantilevered SeaView bar on Royal Princesses' port side where they can partake in cocktails and spectacular seaviews.

Princess Cruises also confirmed that Royal Princess will feature an adults-only pool surrounded by seven private cabanas, as well as two additional pools which will sit on either side of a tropical island that is to serve as a poolside relaxation spot by day and an outside dance club at night.

Royal Princess will also feature expanded versions of the cruise line's signature Sanctuary, Movies Under the Stars and Piazza atrium areas.

The vessel's outside staterooms will feature balconies, whilst Royal Princess will also feature a grand total of 260,000 square-feet of inside public space for dining, entertainment and "other special features".



Brazil's cruise investment

THE BRAZILIAN PORTS OF SANTOS AND RIO DE Janerio are set to get a breath of fresh life, with a new government initiative which includes a US\$400m investment into port infrastructure upgrades in the lead up to the nation's hosting of the 2014 FIFA World Cup.

Carnival Corp's earnings

CARNIVAL CORPORATION AND PLC HAS ANNOUNCED its first quarter 2011 earnings per share were diluted \$0.19 which is at the high end of its previous guidance range of between \$0.15 and \$0.19.

In addition, the company said that because of the rise in fuel costs since its initial 2011 full year guidance was released in Dec 2010, combined with currency exchange rates, its full year earnings per share would be lower by approximately \$0.40.

Carnival has also estimated that with the impact of Middle Eastern and North African itinerary changes it will experience an approximate \$0.05 reduction in earnings per share for the remainder of the year.

"The company now forecasts full year 2011 fully diluted earnings per share to be in the range of \$2.50 to \$2.60, compared to its Dec guidance range of \$2.90 to \$3.10 and fiscal 2010 of \$2.47," a Carnival statement said.
