2 ships in Cirq Quay

THIS weekend, for the first time two cruise ships will share the Overseas Passenger Terminal at Circular Quay in Sydney.

Made possible by the size of the ships, PONANT's 142m-long *Le Soleal* will slip in beside the 180m-long *Azamara Quest* on Sat morning, due to dock at 10am.

The 458-guest Seabourn Odyssey and 382-guest Silver Whisper will be docked at White Bay Cruise Terminal in Rozelle.

Duffy content on capacity

CARNIVAL Cruise Line president Christine Duffy admits there is no immediate intention to ramp up capacity for the cruise company in Australian waters anytime soon, with the market already buoyant.

In Sydney last week, Duffy all but completed her task of stepping on board each of Carnival's 25 ships in just over 12 months since her appointment as president.

The one-time travel agent used her visit down under to inspect Carnival's year-round Australiabased vessel *Carnival Spirit* and her sister-ship *Carnival Legend* - which operates from here the majority of the year.

Duffy said there was no plan to have *Legend* based permanently in local waters, with the 2,680pax required to service Carnival's Alaska Inside Passage demand.

"We've increased our capacity here quite a bit. Bringing *Legend* here two-thirds of the year, and with all the other capacity increases that Australia is seeing, we think that is a good measure for us," Duffy said.

Speaking with *Cruise Weekly*, Duffy heaped praise on the trade.

"Agents are very important for us. I am still a strong believer that the best way to get on the right cruise for you, depending on what kind of vacation you are looking for, is to get the advice of a professional travel agent.

"There are so many cruise brands and they are all different. We often talk about the importance of the right person on the right cruise for the right occasion.

"We've done a lot this year and are really continuing to make it easier for agents to work with Carnival. We have a level playing field and we are very supportive of the trade," she told **CW**.

Duffy will fulfil her ambition of inspecting all of Carnival's ships next week in San Juan when she visits *Carnival Liberty*.

Anthem hit by storm

ANTHEM of the Seas has turned back to Cape Liberty, New Jersey after being hit by a storm off the south-east US coast.

Guests were asked to stay in their rooms, with many taking to social media where photos are circulating of a collapsed ceiling & public areas in disarray. Four minor injuries have been reported and Royal Caribbean International said in a statement there has been no damage to *Anthem* that would affect the seaworthiness of the ship.

"Safety is our highest priority and ships are designed to withstand even more extreme circumstances than *Anthem of the Seas* encountered," the statement read.

"While the weather was unpleasant, the ship remained seaworthy at all times."
