Three Carnival ships repositioned

THREE Carnival Cruise Line ships will be repositioned to new homeports in the USA from 2018.

Carnival Vista will move to Galveston with two week-long cruise itineraries available yearround starting 23 Sep, 2018.

Carnival Breeze will be the newest and largest ship in the fleet to sail from Port Canaveral, commencing with a one-off six day cruise on 30 Sep before settling into year-round departures of up to 14-days.

Carnival Magic will sail from Miami with a year-round schedule of seven-day departures from 30 Sep cruising throughout the Caribbean.

Viking Spirit down under

VIKING Cruises confirmed on Fri it will operate a series of sailings aboard the brand new Viking Spirit in Australia during its inaugural season when it enters service in 2018/19.

As exclusively reported by Cruise Weekly last week, Viking has overnight berths booked in Sydney Harbour for the 2018/19 wave season on 16 & 17 Dec, 12, 13 & 14 Jan, 09, 10 & 11 Feb, and 09 & 10 Mar in 2019 (*CW* Tue).

Vikings' itineraries in this region will include a 17-day Bali-Sydney voyage dubbed the Komodo and the Australian Coast, on 16 Dec 2018, operating in the return direction on 10 Mar 2019.

Revealed yesterday, Viking will include a port call in Newcastle as part of the voyage, building on a newly-forged partnership with Hunter Travel Group.

A 15-day Sydney to Auckland (and reverse) cruise will

operate between Dec-Feb, with overnight stays in both cities as well as visiting Melbourne, Hobart, Dunedin, Christchurch, Wellington, Napier and Tauranga.

Chairman Torstein Hagen said the company's destinationfocused itineraries were built on the same successful principles infused in river itineraries.

Viking managing director ANZ, the recently appointed Michelle Black said: "Our ships are like no other, contemporary yet classic, spacious yet intimate".

"They certainly boast more than their share of wow factors.

"We're thrilled to have Viking Spirit based here for summer 18/19," she told Cruise Weekly.

Before then, Viking Sun will stop in Sydney during a world cruise on 10 Feb 2018 at White Bay.

Viking will take delivery of its third and fourth ocean ships, Viking Sky & Viking Sun, in 2017.

CLIA shuffles deck

CLIA Australasia commercial director, Brett Jardine will step down at the end of next month as part of a number of organisational changes.

Jardine joined the organisation in 2007 and has recently been split across marketing, membership, trade engagement and events.

There will be no direct replacement for Jardine, instead Vera Huntink, previously digital marketing consultant for CLIA Australasia since Sep, will be promoted to CLIA Australasia marketing manager and Peter Kollar, head of training and development Australasia, will take on int'l responsibilities.

The newly created role of advocacy director will be filled by ex-Carnival Australia general counsel Dimity McCredie and another new position will focus on membership engagement, events and CLIA's Executive Partner program.





Ponant Kimberley 2018

PONANT has released the new departure dates for its 2018 Kimberley season, following the successful promotion of its debut 2017 voyages to the far north.

"The sales success of our inaugural 2017 season, about to get underway this Jul, has continued unabated, prompting us to schedule a further series of voyages in 2018," Ponant's vice president Australasia Monique Ponfoort said.

Two 10-night sailings have been announced between Darwin and Broome on 19 Jul and 08 Aug and two reverse itineraries on 29 Jul and 18 Aug 2018.

The journeys, all sailing on board *L'Austral*, take in key Kimberley highlights including Hunter River, King George Falls, Mitchell Falls, Montgomery Reef and Horizontal Falls.

The 2018 expedition team will be led by renowned photographer and adventurer

Mick Fogg who will be joined by a group of 12 marine biologists, naturalists and conservationists.

Prices for the departure start at \$8,510 per person in a Deluxe Stateroom with private balcony.

Vard mystery order

VARD has signed a letter of intent with an undisclosed international cruise company for the design and construction of an expedition cruise ship.

The approx NOK 1 billion (AU\$156m) luxury ship will be around 145m long, 20m wide and accommodate 220 passengers.

A firm contract is expected within Q1 2017, subject to several conditions being met, including satisfactory financing.

The hull of the vessel will be built by Vard's shipyard in Tulcea, Romania, and delivery is scheduled from one of Vard's Norwegian yards in 2019.

MSC birthday deal

PASSENGERS celebrating their birthday during selected MSC Cruises sailings will be able enjoy their journey free of charge.

Bookings must have at least one paying passenger and a maximum of one free birthday passenger.

The birthday must fall on one of the cruising days (excluding arrival and departure days).

To be eligible for the deal the voyage must be locked in before 10 Mar.
