APT 2019 Croatia cruising sold out

APT has seen such strong demand for next year's inaugural season of small-ship coastal cruising in Croatia that it has just opened up 2020 departures for sale, with 2019 fully sold out.

The company has chartered the brand new *Queen Eleganza* in partnership with Noble Caledonia, with the purpose-built yacht-style small ship featuring 18 cabins and undertaking week-long voyages on itineraries between Dubrovnik and Zagreb.

Australian travel agents have been among the first to experience the newbuild, with APT hosting two back-to-back voyages for top achievers and VIPs this month.

Mladen Vukic, the company's small ships product manager, told *Cruise Weekly* APT was thrilled to see its expectations of strong demand for the product fulfilled.




Vukic said the unique APT small ship program saw the 18-cabin vessel cruise between the islands of the Adriatic each day, stopping in a different port in the evening so guests could experience destinations after the crowds from larger cruise ships had gone.

The new product added to the cruise line's Local Connections initiative harnesses the knowledge and skills of local New Zealand experts across every port in the country.



The dramatic incident was caught on camera (pictured) off the coast of Pleasant Island in Alaska, leaving the passengers and crew soaked talk about photo bombing!




Cruiseco launches sixth Collections Brox
