CLIA chooses cruise

CRUISE Lines International Association (CLIA) Australasia has rebranded its "Plan a Cruise Month" in Oct to "Choose Cruise" in a bid to drive more bookings.

"Choose Cruise is an opportunity for travel lovers to learn more about the different cruise options available, and to take advantage of promotions and value-adds from cruise experts," said CLIA Australasia and Asia md Joel Katz.

The Choose Cruise push will involve trade, consumer and media activities, as well as a dedicated microsite.

NCL reveals plans for two new ships

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line (NCL) has confirmed orders for a fifth and sixth ship in its new Project Leonardo Class fleet, each carrying 3,300 guests and designed for energy efficiency.

The 140,000 gross tonne ships will be built by Fincantieri in Italy and are due for delivery in 2026 and 2027.

"Following the Breakaway Plus Class...the highly anticipated Leonardo Class will fuel future growth with exciting and innovative offerings that will meaningfully drive demand from new and loyal returning guests alike," said NCL president and ceo Andy Stuart.

The new ships have been designed to have a lower environmental impact, a point that NCL believes would lead to a broader range of deployment opportunities.

Parent company Norwegian



Cruise Line Holdings now has seven ships on order for NCL and one for Regent Seven Seas Cruises, giving it eight vessels for delivery through to 2027.

It will take delivery of its next ship, *Norwegian Encore*, in the northern Autumn of 2019.

The latest vessels (rendering

pictured) have yet to be named, and details of their features will be announced at a later date.

The news follows NCL ramping up its efforts in the Australian market, last year kicking off its inaugural homeport season in Australia and New Zealand (*TD* 13 Nov 17).

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Pandaw ramps up India



PANDAW has announced plans to expand its cruise offering in India, deploying two more ships to the region and adding two new itineraries.

The decision follows a strong customer reaction to the company's Lower Ganges river cruise due to sail in Dec.

"The response to our announcement in May that we will place our own ship, RV Orient Pandaw, on the Lower Ganges River from Dec 2018, has been truly phenomenal," said Pandaw founder Paul Strachan.

As a result Pandaw will sail two new routes, an Upper Ganges

cruise to the city of Varanasi on the *RV Katha Pandaw*, and sailings of the Brahmaputra River aboard *RV Indochina Pandaw*.

Bolstering its expanded range of cruise options is the accompanying announcement of new pre- and post- cruise tours that include a two-night exploration of Kolkata and a sixnight Golden Triangle trip through Delhi, Agra and Rajasthan.

The news follows the announcement earlier this month that the *Andaman Explorer* will be deployed to explore the Andaman Islands (*CW* 06 Jul).

Caribbean recovery

POPULAR cruising destinations in the Eastern Caribbean are showing signs of recovery after the impact of hurricanes Irma and Maria last year, with the British Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, St Maarten and the US Virgin Islands (USVI) all recording gains in tourism numbers.

Puerto Rico, St Maarten and the USVI welcomed more than 10,000 cruise passengers per day by Jan, with San Juan experiencing cruise passenger satisfaction levels higher than those preceding the storms by mid-Feb.

"We consider our destination partners more like family, and we could not be prouder to see the Eastern Caribbeancome back stronger than ever," said Michele Paige, president of the Florida-Caribbean Cruise Association.

Peregrine Africa debut



PEREGRINE Adventures has announced it has added Africa to its Adventure Cruising program for 2019, expanding to its third continent in as many years.

The Africa program involves an eight-day Cruising Safari: West Africa river cruise from Senegal to The Gambia which visit UNESCOlisted deltas and provides the opportunity to view chimpanzees in the wild and dolphin estuaries.

Packages for the new African expedition voyage starts from \$3,140 per person twin share.

The decision to make a move on the African market follows

a period of solid growth for the company, having posted a 35% improvement in the Aussie market over the last 12 months.

"Our travellers have responded to a style on the water that is akin to our style on the land - authentic and low-impact travel," said Peregrine Adventure Cruising general manager Filippos Venetopoulos.

"These are cruises for travellers who would never normally choose a cruise," he added.

Crystal revels in Ravel



CRYSTAL Cruises has held a christening ceremony to officially welcome its fifth river ship, *Crystal Ravel*.

The event took place in the Hungarian capital of Budapest last week, and involved the cruise line's president and chief executive officer Tom Wolber, as well as the ship's godmother, philanthropist and musician Mariann Peller.

Festivities on the day included a performance from tenor Steffan Mullan, as well as the Young Virtuosos artists who all played following the traditional blessing.

With *Ravel* now added to the fleet, she joins her identical sister

ships Crystal Bach, Crystal Mahler and Crystal Debussy; as well as the larger Crystal Mozart.

"In just over two years, we introduced five ships, which is a tremendous accomplishment of growth for this expansion of the Crystal brand," said Wolber.

Ravel is currently sailing itineraries of six to 14 days between Vienna and Basel, and next year she will be the only river ship to sail seven-night Danube cruises round-trip from Vienna to ports in Austria, Hungary and Slovakia.
