# Northern Europe hot for MSC

AUSTRALIAN and NZ travellers are wholeheartedly embracing MSC Cruises' itineraries in Northern Europe, according to Communications Manager, Leisa Chell (pictured).

Speaking to Cruise Weekly aboard MSC Euribia this week as the vessel undertakes a cruise from Copenhagen up the Norwegian coast (see page 2), Chell confirmed the voyages have "definitely increased in popularity with the local market".

The ongoing unrest in Ukraine and Russia has seen MSC rejig its Baltic itineraries this year, eliminating visits to Russian ports, meaning a number of its Northern Europe cruises now conveniently depart from Southampton.

These popular voyages take in destinations such as Brussels, the Netherlands, and Norway as well as the British Isles.

"As COVID meant many expat Brits couldn't visit home, and Australians couldn't tour Europe. they are now travelling and booking a cruise, which allows guests to visit many countries affordably," Chell noted.

An innovation reflecting the increasing onboard cohort of English, Australian, and New

Zealand guests has seen kettles provided in the cabins of these departures, with Chell saying many are now taking the opportunity to enjoy a "cuppa" and unwind after a day of exploring, with complimentary English breakfast and Earl Grey teas provided.


The current Euribia departure in the North Sea strongly reflects MSC's pan-European appeal, with guests on board from Germany, Belgium, France, Spain, Portugal and Italy as well as Australians.

GUESTS aboard MSC Euribia yesterday were given some special help during the ship's innovative compulsory safety briefing - and all it required was that they just look up.

The newbuild boasts a 1,250m<sup>2</sup> central promenade with boutiques, restaurants and retail outlets - as well as the "longest LED dome at sea" (pictured).

The massive ceiling is effectively a screen soaring high over the deck, and can be programmed to display just about anything.

It's natural that during the safety procedure, which required guests to find their muster stations and swipe their cards to confirm attendance, the directions were assisted by a high-flying graphic indicating which way to the various gathering points on the ship.
