### APT details new river ships

APT'S two new river ships for its Rhine, Main and Danube cruises (CW 22 Aug) will be named APT Solara and APT Ostara.

The new vessels, announced as part of APT's 2025 Europe Pre-Release collection, will launch next year, with the cruise line saying they will "set a new standard in sustainability", ensuring greater emphasis on saving fuel, energy optimisation, and waste reduction.

They will welcome only 154 guests on board, who will be serviced by 60 crew members.

Guests will have a choice of three well-appointed suite options including Twin Window suites, Balcony suites, and Owner's suites.

Each ship will feature six worldclass, all-inclusive dining options, including the main restaurant, an intimate wine cellar, a relaxing conservatory, a casual

dining option, an exclusive aft restaurant, and rooftop dining, while passengers will also be able to dine in their stateroom.

The ships will also feature a sun deck, where guests will find a heated pool, al fresco dining, and a lounge area to relax.

They were conceived in Melbourne by design practice Hecker Guthrie, will aim to create "a European experience through Australian eyes".

APT has also announced it will venture into Northern Europe next year, with three brand-new **Small Ship Expedition Cruising** itineraries aboard Seabourn Cruise Line's Seabourn Venture.

Guests will be able to choose from a range of all-inclusive itineraries, such as a 14-day Arctic Explorer Small Ship Expedition, cruising from Reykjavik return, exploring the coastlines of Iceland and Greenland. MS

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**ROYAL** Caribbean International (RCI) is selling a USD\$100,000 gold cup (pictured) on its new ship Icon of the Seas, which includes a lifetime drinks package.

The cup is on sale at Icon's store, which sells RCI-branded jewellery, according to Royal Caribbean Blog, an unofficial forum which reports on the cruise line.

The blog estimates it would take the "average" cruiser about 151 seven-day voyages to break even on the cup, but we're sure some could manage to do a lot better than that.

**CARNIVAL** Corporation and Fincantieri are rumoured to be putting the finishing touches on a USD\$5b deal, according to The Maritime Executive.

It would reportedly be a record-breaking order both in the size of the cruise ships and the dollar value.

### Maud out of service until Apr



**HX HAS** announced its ship Maud (pictured) will remain out of service until Apr, after taking weather damage last month.

Following necessary repairs, Maud will head to the British Isles, the Arctic, and Antarctica for a series of new itineraries.

The new cruises will see Maud's prior schedule of voyages between 03 Feb and 16 Mar cancelled, with HX curating a range of options for those booked on one of these sailings.

Guests can now choose to experience the same Northern Lights itinerary on board Spitsbergen, subject to availability, or can rebook another voyage between Jan and Apr.

This includes select Norway sailings with sister brand, Hurtigruten, such as the North Cape Express, a Classic Roundtrip voyage from Bergen, and sailings from Hamburg on Otto, with pax able to retain their original cabin category choice, where available, when choosing this option.

Those affected by these changes also have the option to receive a future cruise voucher to book a new expedition at a later date, or

a full refund.

Maud's new season will see her set sail for an expedition around the British Isles from mid-Apr.

HX will welcome Scottish weather presenter Carol Kirkwood on its second British Isles journey, where she will engage guests with insightful talks and Q&A sessions while sailing from Douglas to Dover.

Maud will then venture into the Arctic, offering guests unparalleled expeditions to Greenland and Iceland, before heading south to Antarctica for a series of new itineraries, which will also visit Chile, and Patagonia's fjords. MS
