"While I can't disclose too many details just yet, I can reveal that Celebrity Xcel will introduce seven new experiences that live up to her name in every way," she told Cruise Weekly.

The construction of *Xcel* began last month with the laying of the first keel (CW 17 Jun).

Hodges Bethge, on board Celebrity's President's Cruise last week (CW 28 Jun), is already building excitement for the line's fifth Edge-class ship.

"We've designed these with our guests in mind, offering experiences unlike any other at sea," Hodges Bethge added. Xcel will also be equipped with the cruise industry's first tri-fuel engine, Hodges Bethge shared,

meaning she will be able to run on biofuels, methanol, and traditional marine fuels.

"This innovative feature is part of our decades-long commitment to sustainability and advances our energy transition efforts under Royal Caribbean Group's SEA the Future platform," she said.

"With every new ship, we strive to sustain the planet, energise communities, and accelerate innovation, ensuring we continue to deliver the best premium vacation experience responsibly."

Xcel will offer seven-night itineraries for her inaugural season, with sailings to the Bahamas, Mexico, the Cayman Islands, Puerto Plata, St. Thomas, and St. Maarten. MS

HURTIGRUTEN has retrieved another 4,500 sparkling wine bottles from the Arctic Sea off the coast of Norway.

The cruise line launched the Bubbles from the Sea concept last year (CW 22 May 2023), the first underwater-aged sparkling wine matured in the Arctic region.

A new batch of bottles has been stored and collected. this time from in the far northeastern part of Norway near Kirkenes.

The 2024 batch, which was submerged last year (CW 22 Dec), comprises 4,500 bottles stored at a depth of 34 metres.

Ageing in colder seas (five degrees celsius) with a higher pressure and constant darkness will provide a very distinctive maturation of the wine.

Due to high demand, the next batch will increase to as many as 5,000 bottles - bottoms up to all Hurtigruten passengers!

## DCL's culinary Treasures

**NEW** culinary adventures aboard Disney Cruise Line's (DCL) Disney Treasure will include the brand's first-ever venue themed around The Aristocats: a new Guardians of the Galaxy offering; and a Coco-inspired menu.

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A direct extension of the Grand Hall, the Scat Cat Lounge (pictured) will offer guests a craft cocktail menu, in addition to live music and performances of classic songs like *Ev'rybody* Wants to be a Cat from The Aristocats.

The Scat Cat Lounge also takes design cues from the Grand Hall's Agrabah-inspired architecture with a complementary colour palette and curated decor.

Symbols of cats, both hidden and overt, will help bring the animated adventures of Duchess and her kittens into the real world for the first time.

Meanwhile, Worlds of Marvel, DCL's Marvel-themed dining experience, will host Treasure guests for two nights per cruise, including a brand-new offering that will showcase Rocket and Groot from the Guardians of the Galaxy films.

Throughout the evening, guests



will eat to the beat of a mix of hit songs from decades past, and have the chance to test their Marvel knowledge.

Guests on Treasure will also experience 'Avengers: Quantum Encounter', a fan-favourite cinematic dining adventure following Ant-Man and The Wasp, as they work to protect new Quantum Core technology from a fearsome foe.

Meanwhile, at Plaza de Coco, an array of artful dishes will transport guests to the picturesque town depicted in Coco, with traditional recipes from the Rivera family's kitchen to guide a modern menu with festive flavours. MS

#### Princess is in Love

LOVE by Britto, Princess Cruises' newest high-end specialty restaurant, has officially opened aboard the line's new Sun Princess.

The new restaurant is located on deck 17 aft, the 68-seat venue featuring an exquisite display of Romeo Britto's familiar designs, and carries a cover charge of \$79pp.

The seven-course dining experience begins with oysters with lemongrass kafir, mirin and gold flakes.

Mains include savoury tuna & avocado, pomegranate, togarashi; cappuccino of wild mushroom soup; salad of beets, figs and goat cheese; granita of pink champagne & rose petals; tail of lobster thermidor; and beef tenderloin & truffle jus.

Desserts features a heartshaped chocolate lava cake, fresh berries & raspberry cream, and petits fours.

Additional special touches include vibrant dinnerware featuring Britto's art, heartfolded napkins and cutlery with heart-shaped cut outs.
