HAL ready to rock

FIFTEEN new stage shows will make their debut on Holland America Line's upcoming 2025 Grand World and Pole to Pole voyages when both ships depart in Jan 2025.

Produced by Blackburn International, the slate of new shows will be presented on each ship by a team of eight singers and dancers.

Shows will include tribute performances to legendary artists and bands including Carole King, Eagles, The Carpenters, Fleetwood Mac and more, while others will adopt broader themes such as 'Sounds of Summer', 'Solid Gold' and 'Crossroads'.

The new entertainment will complement the existing lineup of comedians, headline entertainers, local performers, resident musicians and major theatre productions.

"The new shows are a diverse collection of music genres to appeal to a wide variety of tastes," said HAL VP Entertainment, Bill Prince. HAL's 124-day Grand World

Voyage sets sail westbound on 04 Jan 2025 from Fort Lauderdale, while the 133-day Pole to Pole sailing travels south-north-south.

RCI to revisit kids curfew

ROYAL Caribbean International CEO Michael Bayley says the line will consider expanding and enforcing its 1am kids curfew for children aged 17 and under to specific areas of the ship such as bars, pools and lounges.

Speaking onboard Utopia of the Seas last week, Bayley said the line is aware of increased negative feedback from cruisers about the free rein of children onboard late at night, with some travellers opting to sail with more adult-oriented cruise lines.

Currently, security staff enforce the curfew from 1am by asking children to return to their cabins and checking the keycards and wristbands in public areas.

Bayley said the line will always be a family brand but that "we do need to make sure that we respect the adults".

CARNIVAL Splendor has departed Sydney for the final time in its current form as it heads to Singapore for a range of new onboard upgrades.

The brief dry dock will see the ship return to Australia in Sep with new onboard dining offerings and refreshed spaces for children and adults.

The three-week journey will see the ship arrive in Singapore on 05 Aug before beginning its return journey on 24 Aug.

Carnival Splendor was last refurbished in 2019, prior to its debut in Australia.

Barca records fall

BARCELONA has welcomed more than one million cruise travellers for the first six months of 2024 across 323 ship calls, port authorities said.

The result is a 3.9% increase on the prior year, with the higher number coming from fewer ships, while more than 80% of pax began or ended their voyage in the city.
