The king of cruises

PRINCESS Cruises' Crown Princess is soon set to call Sydney home, with the 100day countdown on until the arrival of the biggest ship the line has ever based year-round in Australia.

Crown will debut Down Under on 26 Oct, with the 3,090-guest ship to make almost 80 visits to more than 20 ports around Australia.

The season will also see Crown set sail on what is believed to be the biggest world cruise ever undertaken by any line, with the vessel set to embark on an epic 113-night circumnavigation of the globe departing local shores in May.

Scenic launches Asia '25 **SCENIC** Luxury Cruises & Tours has launched its ultimate Asia ocean and river cruising journeys

for next year, which will take guests to experience some of the most captivating destinations across South East and North Asia.

A highlight of the collection is the 'Ultimate Journey through South East Asia', a 28-day sailing exploring the Mekong on board Scenic Spirit, before travelling to Indonesia and Taipei on board Scenic Eclipse II.

There is also the 'Ultimate East Coast, Northern Australia & The Indonesian Archipelago' on board Scenic Eclipse II, for those seeking a unique island-hopping holiday.

This 28-day voyage sails from Auckland through New Zealand's Bay of Islands and onto the Whitsunday Islands and the Great Barrier Reef, before venturing to some of the more remote islands of Indonesia

Scenic will also offers a 17-day 'Japan & South Korea In Depth' itinerary, where guests can experience 16 different ports.

Travellers after a more intimate cruising option can enjoy the 'Treasures of the Mekong' on board Scenic Spirit, a 13-day river cruise and land journey taking in Siem Reap and Angkor Wat, before traversing to Vietnam.

Highlights of this itinerary include an exclusive dinner at an Angkor temple, an excursion in Phnom Penh travelling along the waterfront in a tuk tuk, and visiting the Royal Palace of Cambodia, which serves as the official royal residence for the country's king.

Travellers will also sail on local sampans in Vietnam to discover the historic towns of Tan Chau and Sa Dec, before arriving in Ho Chi Minh City.

Encore avoids Red

SEABOURN Cruise Line has unveiled a range of new itineraries for Seabourn Encore next year, as part of a a repositioning designed to avoid hostility in the Red Sea.

Originally scheduled to sail west from Asia to Europe, Encore will instead go the long way, crossing both the Pacific and Atlantic as she shifts from Singapore to Dubrovnik via the Panama Canal.

The result is an impromptu series of northern spring itineraries featuring 36 ports in 18 countries, including Encore's first visit to the US.

Cruisers can explore more of Southeast Asia, Hawaii, the Panama Canal and the Western Mediterranean between Mar-May, with 18 maiden calls among the port line-up, and overnights including Ho Chi Minh City and Honolulu.
