Princess Olympics

THOSE holidaying with Princess Cruises this winter can catch some of the most anticipated events from the upcoming Olympic Games.

A highlight will see two former Olympians present to guests aboard Sky Princess, including Michael Edwards, also known as Eddie the Eagle.

The English ski jumper became the first competitor to represent Great Britain in Olympic ski jumping in 1988, portrayed in the 2016 film Eddie the Eagle.

Retired British sprinter Derek Redmond will also speak to guests, the former British record holder for the 400m.


Redmond is known globally for tearing his hamstring at the start of the 400 metres semifinal at the 1992 Olympics, before bravely finishing the race limping, with his father running onto the track to help him cross the line.

Princess will host live viewing parties on the Lido Deck throughout the Olympics, with special food and beverage offerings, and sports-themed activities, where guests can watch the action on the line's 28m² poolside screen.

There will also be the 'Cruise Olympics', where guests can win medals for their country with different daily events, including basketball, table tennis, golf, swimming, soccer and more.

Other activities will include a game show; Olympic-themed trivia; a family sports day showcasing shot put, javelin, long jump, and archery; and even breakdancing classes, showcasing the newest sport in the Olympics.

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Women to lead Cunard speaker program

CUNARD Line has signed up three iconic Australian women - former politician Julie Bishop. singer & actress Kate Ceberano, and jockey Michelle Payne - to inspire the 2024-2025 local summer program.

The season will see Former Minister for Foreign Affairs Julie Bishop (pictured second from left) take to the stage of Queen Elizabeth's Royal Court Theatre during the ship's 12-night sailing from Fremantle to Sydney, departing 05 Nov.

She will share stories about her political career spanning more than 20 years, and her academic and charitable achievements.

"I am eagerly awaiting the return of Cunard's luxurious liner Queen Elizabeth and to join the final leg of the voyage from Fremantle to Sydney in Nov," Bishop said.

"As this will be my second trip on board this magnificent ship, I







again hope to meet many guests during my early morning jogs around the deck."

Meanwhile, Ceberano (pictured left) and Payne (pictured right) will stimulate guests aboard Queen Elizabeth's Queensland sailing from 17 to 27 Nov.

Ceberano is a legend in soul, jazz, and pop, and has also starred in films and musicals. such as Jesus Christ Superstar.

Payne became the first and only female jockey to win the Melbourne Cup in 2015, riding Prince of Penzance.

Other talent on board this summer is Australian basketball player Luc Longley (pictured second from right), who will join

Queen Elizabeth's San Francisco to Sydney sailing from 22 Sep to 18 Oct.

Longley became the first Australian to play in the NBA in 1991, going on to play for four teams over 10 seasons.

President Katie McAllister said the guest speaker program is a vital aspect of Cunard's soughtafter onboard experience.

"Recognising our guests' enthusiasm for learning and broadening their perspectives, we've meticulously selected speakers for the upcoming Australia season who can both captivate and enlighten our guests during their voyage with us," she said. MS

Disney's big profit

DISNEY Cruise Line has sailed away with more than US\$200 million in dividends from its private Bahamian island Castaway Cay.

The line acquired a 99-year lease on the island from the govt in 1997, and according to Forbes, Disney has paid itself US\$220m in dividends from it over the past decade.

Disney's 'Magical Cruise Company' subsidiary, which operates the cruise line, has been paid the six-figure sum by Bahamas-based DCL Island Development, which runs Castaway Cay.

There is no compulsory requirement for companies to file financial statements in the Bahamas, masking the actual profit Castaway Cay generates.

The first guests set foot on the island in Jul 1998, after the cruise line launched its first ship, Disney Magic.

Insignia rescue

OCEANIA Cruises' Insignia rescued 68 migrants heading for Spain last week.

Six migrants also unfortunately died during the incident, Reuters reported.

The people were trying to reach the Canary Islands but were trapped in a fishing boat which had stalled in rough seas, Spanish authorities and Oceania said on Fri.

Bulk carrier Philipp Oldendorff sighted the boat adrift 440 nautical miles south of Tenerife, and provided first assistance to the migrants, while Insignia was diverted to the area to pick up the survivors, the Spanish Coast Guard said in a statement.

Insignia is currently undertaking a 180-day world cruise, which began in Jan.

"Safety of life at sea is of paramount importance for all seafarers," an Oceania spokesperson said.

"Insignia rescued 68 people from a vessel in distress between Cape Verde and Tenerife, [and] brought them on board," they said.



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
