Oceania ATW 2026

OCEANIA Cruises has announced its 2026 'Around the World' voyage aboard its newest ship Oceania Vista.

The 180-day world journey will see the ship sail into Australian waters for the first time, visiting Sydney, Mooloolaba, Airlie Beach, Townsville, Cairns, and Darwin.

Vista will voyage to six continents, visit 43 countries, 101 ports, and access 81 **UNESCO** World Heritage sites over the course of the World Voyage, with pre-registration available now, and bookings open from next Thu.

The global circumnavigation will set sail from Miami on 06 Jan 2026, crossing three oceans and 18 seas, exploring Australia, as well as Southeast Asia, the South Pacific, Europe, and South America.

"After the remarkable success of our most recent world cruises, we have been eagerly anticipating the opportunity to present travellers with an even more extraordinary experience for our 2026 voyage," President Frank Del Rio Jr remarked.

"With that, we are excited to announce that Vista, Oceania Cruises' pinnacle of luxury and newest ship, will circumnavigate the globe artfully intertwining diverse continents, enriching cultures, and mouthwatering cuisines, creating an unforgettable tapestry of exploration for our guests," he added.

"We are excited to offer a rare chance to experience the world from an entirely new perspective, and further forward the future of global cruising," Del Rio added.

Broome's big opportunity

TOURISM WA Managing Director Carolyn Turnbull says the expansion of border services at the Port of Broome (CW 27 Feb) will deliver a welcome boost to tourism in the state.

Turnbull said the granting to Broome of "first point of entry" status to Australia is expected to support the growth of tourism in not just the Kimberley region, but the state as a whole.

"Broome becoming a first point of arrival for cruise vessels will have flow-on opportunities down the coastline, as vessels will have the opportunity to consider Dampier and Geraldton ports of call before arriving in Fremantle," Turnbull said.

"This would allow cruise vessels on international itineraries to make Broome their gateway to the state, allowing more international visitors to explore the dreamlike landscapes of Australia's ancient North West region," she added.

The destination management organisation's Managing Director said cruise tourism is a significant contributor to Western Australia's visitor economy, generating \$333.5 million in economic impact for the state.

"Tourism WA works across government and with industry stakeholders to promote Western Australia as the western gateway to cruise line companies and we

are excited by the opportunity this approval provides.

"To grow this economic contribution even more, in Jul 2023, the WA Government released the WA Cruise Tourism Strateaic Plan 2023-2033 which aims to grow the tourism sector through a range of demand, supply and capability building actions," Turnbull noted.

"A key demand focus identified in the strategy relates to cruise line attraction, to encourage global cruise brands to add WA to their cruise itineraries." MS

TUI grows Emirates pact
