BEDA cruise ready

THE Brisbane Economic Development Agency (BEDA) will run an eight-week training program to help businesses across tourism, hospitality and retail boost sales and capitalise on the city's \$1.5 billion dollar cruise industry sector.

A recent economic impact assessment of cruise tourism in Australia found Brisbane is now the country's second biggest cruise port, with 196 ships arriving in 2023/24.

Beginning next week, the program has 15 local tourism operators enrolled including businesses in Brisbane, Moreton Bay, Redland City, Logan and the Scenic Rim.

These businesses include local tour operators, attractions, event planners, First Nations and eco-tourism experiences, and even a Harry Potter themed store and cafe.

The program is designed to provide each with knowledge and industry networks to develop and market new shore experiences for cruise visitors as well as pre- and post-cruise itinerary extensions.

Australian Cruise Association CEO Jill Abel said Brisbane has become a key destination for cruise, with world-class port facilities boosting the sector.

"The Cruise Tourism Trade Ready Program will equip shore-side attractions with essential tools to thrive in this growing market and help drive an increase in transit calls to Brisbane," Abel said.

Brisbane Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said there was a huge opportunity to create more pathways to connect cruise passengers with the city's range of experiences.

Aqua christened in Miami



NORWEGIAN Cruise Line (NCL) has officially christened Norwegian Agua in Miami, with a special appearance from American actor Eric Stonestreet, the ship's godfather.

The christening ceremony took place at Norwegian's terminal at PortMiami, with more than 2,000 guests in attendance, including Cruise Weekly.

"The team at Norwegian, on board and ashore, are the very best of the best, and I am honoured to serve as the godfather of the beautiful Norwegian Aqua," Stonestreet said at the christening.

"As a new cruiser who has a deep passion for travel, it is absolutely spectacular to see the amazing features and experiences that travellers and their families can enjoy aboard Norwegian Aqua, including the world's first hybrid roller coaster and water slide, the Aqua Slidecoaster."

The ceremony saw a preview of Norwegian's newest inhouse production Revolution: A Celebration of Prince, the world's first-ever theatrical concert experience (CW 17 Sep 2024) honouring the singer-songwriter.

Aqua Captain Robert Lundberg also gave remarks, while pastor Pete Pera made an official blessing of the ship, wishing safe travels for all who sail aboard.

The christening concluded with

the ceremonial bottle break across Aqua's hull, initiated by Stonestreet, which signifies good fortune and safe travels for all who sail on board.

"It is a very special time for all of us at NCL - we are welcoming a new incredible ship into our fleet with the christening of the stunning and action-packed Norwegian Aqua, and we are doing so alongside her godfather, Eric Stonestreet, who perfectly embodies the authenticity of what it means for our guests to 'Experience More at Sea,'" NCL President David Herrera said.

The Norwegian head also revealed plans for the expansion of Great Stirrup Cay (CW 21 May), the cruise line's private island destination (more on page 3), which Aqua will visit as part of her christening voyage. MS

HAL extends 2026

HOLLAND America Line (HAL) has extended its 2026 Europe season by six weeks, offering more opportunities to explore the Mediterranean and Norway.

Four additional cruises are now available to book as part of the expansion, including a chance to see the northern lights on a cruise that enters the Arctic Circle.

The extra departure of the popular 14-day 'Arctic Journey and Northern Lights with The History Channel' cruise will set sail on 07 Nov 2026, with the ship staying overnight at Alta, also known as the world's northern lights capital.

Also open for booking is a 14-day 'Mediterranean and Atlantic Treasures: Lisbon Overnight', a seven-day 'Norway with Nordfjord'; and a 15-day 'Cultural Crossing with England and Normandy'.

Each of the newly added cruises will sail aboard Nieuw Statendam roundtrip or oneway from Rotterdam.

MEANWHILE, HAL has kicked off its anniversary sale, with savings, onboard credit and reduced deposits among the offers on sale until 02 Jun.

Departures from Apr 2025 to Apr 2026 are available, with savings of up to 25% off launch fares plus onboard credit of up to US\$300 per stateroom.

Darwin port inquiry

A FEDERAL Senate inquiry has been called for by the Australian Citizens Party (ACP) into claims of national security concerns in the Port of Darwin's 99-year lease to Chinese operator Landbridge.

ACP's Research Director and Senate candidate for Victoria, Robert Barwick, said it was "rank hypocrisy" to claim Landbridge's links to the Chinese Government were grounds for concern, with both major parties promising to cancel the lease if elected.

Barwick backed his comment by saying both major parties, had previously reviewed the lease, including once by Peter **Dutton as Defence Minister** and determined there were no national security concerns.

"The major parties are in a race to the bottom on national security," Barwick said.

Asia expeditions

Norwegian Aqua's top-deck "show-stopper" is the all-new Agua Slidecoaster, the first-ever hybrid water slide-roller coaster. This two-person ride reaches riproaring speeds, as it carves its way around Aqua's sun deck. The dual slides and a magnetic lift propel passengers down thee stories of twists and turns.

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IT PROBABLY isn't a good idea to put a penguin in control of a helicopter during an Antarctic shore excursion, as one pilot learned the hard way.

NCL reveals Great Stirrup Cay makeover

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line (NCL) has revealed the expansion plans for Great Stirrup Cay, its private Caribbean island destination in the Bahamas.

A number of new experiences will make their debut on Great Stirrup Cay in the fourth quarter, alongside the completion of the destination's new multi-ship pier.

An expansive pool area of almost 20km² will be introduced, as will a dedicated bar, and a kids' splash zone.

NCL President David Herrera revealed the news at the christening of the cruise line's new ship Norwegian Aqua (see page 1), after improvements were initially flagged at the announcement of the company's Charting the Course strategy last year (CW 21 May 2024).

The island will feature a new Vibe Beach Club, the adults-only outdoor lounge with private cabanas, loungers and other upgraded amenities.

Also introduced will be Horizon Park, the all-new recreational area that recently debuted on Norwegian Bliss and Norwegian Breakaway, which provides lawn-



style games and a place to gather for families.

A new relaxation area will also be realised, with hammocks and a range of other Tiki-inspired amenities and experiences yet to be revealed.

NCL also committed to plans for more improvements to Great Stirrup Cay in the future, which will be revealed at a later date.

"Later this year we will launch new experiences for our guests to enjoy on this already incredible

private island," Herrera said.

"With our newest ship, Norwegian Aqua, entering into the market with voyages to the Caribbean and the Bahamas, it is the perfect time to start planning your next warm-weather vacation," he added.

Great Stirrup Cay is listed as one of NCL's most popular destinations, and features highlights such as kayaking, ziplining and a complimentary taco station. MS
