A Star is set to rise

STAR of the Seas has officially joined Royal Caribbean's fleet, with construction on the ship complete and the keys officially handed over to the cruise line.

The ship is now one step closer to her debut next month from Port Canaveral, following nearly two years of construction at the Meyer Turku shipyard in Finland.

More than 1,000 crew members and partners gathered to mark the milestone in *Star's* next-level AquaTheater, including Royal Caribbean Group President Jason Liberty and Royal Caribbean CEO Michael Bayley.

Allura delivered as Oceania adds two more ships

OCEANIA Cruises has taken delivery of its eighth ship, the 1,200-guest *Allura* ([pictured), built at Fincantieri in Genoa.

The new ship is the second in Oceania's Allura-class, following her sister ship *Vista*, which was launched in May 2023 (*CW* 09 May 2023).

"Allura is our most innovative and luxurious ship to date," Oceania Chief Luxury Officer Jason Montague declared.

"She represents our bold vision for an entirely new generation of luxury travel experiences."

Allura aims to continue Oceania's legacy as the world's leading culinary-focused luxury cruise line with new dining venues, menus, and more.

Among the new offerings on board is the Creperie, serving delicate desserts; while *Allura* will also return Oceania's signature French restaurant Jacques,



named for Jacques Pepin, the cruise line's first-ever executive culinary director.

Many of the new culinary developments debuting on *Allura* will be rolled out across the fleet during the remainder of this year and into 2026.

Meanwhile, Montague also announced at *Allura's* delivery ceremony that two further ships from Oceania's upcoming Sonataclass will join the fleet in 2032 and 2035.

The vessels, previously ordered as options, have now been confirmed, and will also be built at Fincantieri.

The class will debut with the arrival of the namesake *Sonata* in 2027 (*CW* 06 Jun), followed by her sister ship *Arietta* in 2029. Each vessel will carry

approximately 1,390 guests.

"We are proud to continue our legacy of innovation alongside Fincantieri, our shipbuilding partner for close to 20 years," Montague added.

"These four Sonata-class ships will herald the next stage in the evolution of the Oceania Cruises brand of exceptional small-ship luxury experiences." *MS*

REGENT Seven Seas Cruises (RSSC) has launched more than 200 new sailings as part of its 2027-28 Voyage Collection.

The season includes almost 20 maiden ports of call, three 'Immersive Overnights' itineraries, five 'Grand Voyages', and a 133-night world cruise.

Spanning Australia, the season will also visit Africa & Arabia, Alaska, Asia, Canada & New England, the Caribbean & Panama Canal, the Mediterranean, Northern Europe, South America, the South Pacific, and more.

The highlight of RSSC's Australia program will be a 32-night circumnavigation of the country, round tripping from Sydney aboard *Seven Seas Mariner*.

Six voyages Down Under will also see guests visit Darwin, Perth, and Penneshaw, as well as Wellington, Christchurch, Rotorua, Dusky Sound, and Doubtful Sound in New Zealand, with Mariner to be joined by Seven Seas Splendor (pictured).

The collection also features three journeys through Africa and Arabia, 10 transoceanic crossings, and 60 overnight stays in destinations such as Lima, Reykjavik, and Rio de Janeiro.

Guests can explore new destinations for RSSC, including Nanaimo, Yeosu, Scrabster, and San Andres in Colombia.

Prestige will sail from iconic ports including Barcelona, London, Rome, Athens, Miami, New York City, Los Angeles, and Panama City.

Viking India bound

A NEW 15-day itinerary along the Brahmaputra River in India will be introduced by Viking in late 2027.

Combining land and sea, the itinerary incorporates an eight-day river cruise onboard the new *Viking Brahmaputra*, currently under construction.

The ship will cater to 80 passengers across 40 outside staterooms and is being designed with a shallow draft especially for the Northeast Indian river.

Each room will feature floorto-ceiling sliding glass doors opening to a verandah, with the vessel also offering an open-air sky bar on the top deck and a fitness centre.

Operating round-trip from Delhi, cruisers will sail between Guwahati and Nimati Ghat, with a further seven-day land portion of the itinerary also taking in the country's major sights in Agra and Jaipur.

Thirteen tours are included, taking guests to 10 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, while a range of pre- and postextensions are also available.

The cruise was originally planned to return to Haiti, with the change made "out of an abundance of caution".

Lindblad's double date



NATIONAL Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions has celebrated a double ship naming ceremony in the Galapagos Islands, welcoming National Geographic Delfina and National Geographic Gemini into its fleet (pictured).

The dual naming ceremony took place in Academy Bay in the heart of the Galapagos, where the Lindblad team met with guests, local dignitaries, and community members to witness the ceremonial christening.

Members of the shipboard teams and their children were honoured during the bottle-breaking ceremony, underscoring Lindblad's longstanding commitment to the local community and dedication to preserving the region for generations to come.

Gemini is a "mission-built", 48-guest expedition ship, featuring 28 ocean-facing staterooms, including suites with private balconies.

Offering spacious accommodation opions, *Gemini* plays host to a fitness centre and

spa, a whirlpool hot tub with panoramic views, and a casual al fresco cafe.

The ship is also equipped with a fleet of Zodiacs, kayaks, stand-up paddleboards, and snorkelling gear, and other tools for exploration.

Meanwhile, *Delfina* is a sleek, 30m luxury catamaran designed for immersive explorations.

Accommodating just 16 guests in eight well-appointed staterooms, *Delfina* is suited to families and friendship groups. Guests can enjoy panoramic

views from the open-air observation deck, dine al fresco, and take advantage of state-ofthe-art exploration tools like Zodiacs and other water sports equipment, while exploring the archipelago alongside veteran expedition staff.

The two ships arrive from Celebrity Cruises, where they formerly operated as *Celebrity Xpedition* and *Celebrity Xploration* (*CW* 13 Jun 2024). *MS*

Patriot-ic news

AMERICAN Cruise Line celebrated Independence Day with the christening of *American Patriot* in Newport.

The ship is the first vessel in American's new Patriot-class, a fleet of new 130-passenger ships, which will include American Pioneer, American Maverick, and American Ranger, when they launch later in 2025 and early 2026. Patriot's christening festivities included cruise guests, community members, and officials from Sail Newport, as well as a small group of American's executives and crew members.

Cruise passengers and christening attendees gathered on *Patriot's* top deck for the official blessing and ceremonial bottle smash, followed by a traditional New England clambake at Fort Adams State Park.

Patriot features four decks, private balcony staterooms and suites, a chart room, and spacious lounges, including a top deck lounge.



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
