Carnival Liberty is free to return to cruising

CARNIVAL Cruise Line's *Carnival Liberty* has returned to service from New Orleans, following her troubled dry dock in Europe.

Liberty's return to Louisiana follows a delay to her dry dock, brought on by striking metalworkers, which saw her relocate from the Navantia Shipyard in Spain to another facility in Marseille (*CW* 01 Jul).

Among the additions is a new Heroes Tribute Bar & Lounge, a special space honouring military service members aboard *Liberty*, which has now rejoined her sister ship *Carnival Valor* in NOLA.

Liberty also now features a WaterWorks aqua park (pictured), with new slides added, and a new minigolf course.

The ship's spa, now branded as a Cloud9 Spa, received a full revitalisation, including refreshed decor, upgraded beauty stations,



a modernised fitness centre, a new Elamis Boutique, as well as steam rooms and saunas.

Younger cruisers will find an array of enhanced amenities, like new gaming stations at Camp Ocean and a revamped Arcade and Club O2.

Other additions include a Dream Studio for guests' personalised photo sessions, as well as a Carnival Adventures venue - a one-stop shop for guests to learn about and book shore excursions. The dry dock also prioritised accessibility, with sweeping upgrades throughout the ship, from enhanced pathways to improved amenities in several public spaces and cabins.

The first guests to experience Liberty's new features embarked yesterday on a weeklong Caribbean cruise.

The Conquest-class ship will continue to offer sailings to popular destinations in the Western Caribbean.

Liberty will also make her first visit to *Celebration Key* next week, Carnival's new exclusive destination (*CW* yesterday). *MS*

Tides turn in Nice

Travel Managers

IN A win for the cruise industry, an administrative court in Nice has suspended the efforts of local mayor, Christian Estrosi, to ban large cruise ships from visiting the French Riviera.

The court issued a temporary injunction following Estrosi's unlawful attempt to board Royal Caribbean's *Voyager* of the Seas while she was anchored last week, to force her to leave (**CW** 07 Jul).

The government of the prefect had petitioned the court to block the actions of Estrosi, arguing that the authority to manage cruise ship calls is at the state and federal level, and as such, the mayor and the metropolis had overstepped their authority. In a statement this week,

Estrosi said he will consider pursuing the ship ban in court.

Panama tax over

PANAMA has ended incentives for home porting cruise ships after determining the program did not generate the expected economic impact for the destination.

The government had been reimbursing Panama Canal transit tolls for cruises that embarked or disembarked passengers in the country, but according to local media reports, the program came to an end last month.

Tourism officials had hoped to see greatly increased national benefits, including more cruise traffic, provisioning, hotel nights and passenger spend, which they say did not eventuate.
