VIKING and Uniworld Boutique River Cruises will attempt to defend their National Travel Industry Award (NTIA) titles for a third year running, with both lines nominated for their category's major gong.

The two cruise lines are nominated for the 'Most Popular Ocean Cruise Operator' and 'Most Popular River Cruise Operator' award respectively, joined by 17 other brands put forward in the two categories.

Viking (**pictured**) took out the ocean accolade for a second consecutive year in 2024 (*CW* 28 Oct), and will battle it out to be a 2025 finalist against Celebrity Cruises; Crystal; HX; MSC Cruises; Lindblad Expeditions; Norwegian Cruise Line; Oceania Cruises; Princess Cruises; Quark Expeditions; Royal Caribbean; Silversea; and Virgin Voyages. Meanwhile, Uniworld will also



attempt to retain its crown, against AmaWaterways; APT; Avalon Waterways; Emerald Cruises; Tauck; and Viking, which like last year, has been nominated in both categories.

Other high achievers include Cruiseco, which was put forward for both the 'Most Outstanding Wholesaler - Product/Service' and 'Most Popular Reservations/ Groups Team' awards.

Cruiseabout was recognised in the 'Most Outstanding Branded Leisure Travel Agency' category, and the 'Most Outstanding Marketing Campaign' class.

There are also 30 nominees for the 'Most Outstanding Sales Executive - Cruise' award, while other nominees from around the sector include Cruise Guru ('Most Outstanding Online Travel Agency'); CruiseHQ ('Most Outstanding Wholesaler - Product/Service'); Norwegian ('Most Popular Reservations/ Groups Team'); and CLIA ('Most Outstanding Travel Industry Training Program'). *MS*

Star of the show

PRINCESS Cruises has unveiled a fresh entertainment line-up for its newest Sphereclass ship, Star Princess, which sets sail this Oct.

Guests will be regaled with two original theatrical productions, a candlelight concert series under the stars, and an ensemble of global performers from 24 countries.

The program includes the new Meridian production, described as "a sweeping, cinematic spectacle of longing and liberation, set to a lush original score and reimagined chart-toppers".

In the glass-enclosed Dome atop the ship, guests can also enjoy the Princess Cruises Candlelight Concert Series of live performances blending cinematic storytelling with musical artistry.

Additionally, premiering exclusively on board Star Princess, is Celestial Champagne Soiree, an evening event that combines immersive light, sound, and visual storytelling.

"We're not just putting on shows; we're crafting moments that will stay with guests long after the final curtain," said Vice President of Hotel Operations & Guest Experience, Lorna Warren.

Star Princess will be the third ship to sail for the cruise line under her name.

A Nice outcome for cruise

THE calamitous scenes in Nice last week (CW 07 Jul) will not be repeated, the cruise sector has been assured, following a roundtable between industry stakeholders and local officials.

The discussion followed the stunning actions of Nice Mayor Christian Estrosi earlier that week, who had attempted to board a locally docked cruise ship without authorisation in order to expel her.

Bringing together regional authorities, port stakeholders, and Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA) at the local Alpes-Maritimes Prefecture in Nice (pictured), with the cruise sector received a guarantee of port access and safety coordination for the remainder of the season.

Other key outcomes included the launch of structured dialogue between local authorities and the cruise sector, and reaffirmed support for the smooth continuation of operations during the current season, CLIA said.

"The roundtable held on Fri 11 Jul at the Alpes-Maritimes Prefecture marked a positive and constructive step forward," a statement from CLIA read.

"Representatives from the economic, maritime, and political sectors agreed to launch a consultation process beginning in Sep to discuss the conditions for welcoming cruise ships. "What we welcome in this



initiative is the start of a collective dialogue aimed at identifying practical solutions that will enable the sector to continue operating in the region with clarity and confidence - while also safeguarding the fundamental principles of free trade and freedom of movement."

Estrosi's efforts last week saw him issued with a temporary injunction by a local administrative court (CW 15 Jul).

The opinionated mayor has made no efforts to hide his distaste for the cruise sector in the past, moving to ban ships from docking in Nice (CW 24 Jan).

"We operate within a clear legal framework, and it is essential that this framework remains consistent and predictable for everyone involved," CLIA said following the court's decision.

"We trust that these legal decisions will help bring clarity and reassurance, and we sincerely hope they mark the beginning of a more balanced and collaborative approach - one that upholds the rule of law and where local discussions are guided by dialogue rather than unilateral measures." MS

Asuka III christened

WHAT is said to be Japan's "largest cruise ship ever", Asuka III, has officially been named at her home port of Yokohama (CW 21 Jan).

Japanese shipping company Nippon Yusen (NYK Line) recently christened the 230m-long newbuild at the Osanbashi Int'l Passenger Terminal in Yokohama.

Asuka III, which is the first Japanese-commissioned cruise ship in around 30 years, was then bunkered with liquefied natural gas at the Chuo Wharf in Hakata a few days later.

She (pictured) is scheduled to embark on her maiden voyage on 20 Jul, after which she will join her sister ship, Asuka II, marking the first time that the company will operate two cruise vessels at the same time.

The ship is expected to visit 30 ports throughout Japan, in addition to Yokohama.

She is considered to be the first Japanese-flagged vessel of its type to have been fitted with both a dynamic positioning system and pod propulsion systems, as well as the first in the country to be able to use shore power.

CRUISE lines operating on the Seine in France will now have to watch out for swimmers, with the famous river having recently reopened to the public for the first time in more than 100 years.

Bathing sites will be located near the Notre-Dame de Paris, and the Eiffel Tower, while there will also be one in the east of the French capital.

The Seine originally reopened just for last year's marathon swimming at the Olympics - a scheme that allegedly saw many participants fall ill.

Paris officials are now confident the river is now completely safe for all.

Crew removed by US

US CUSTOMS & Border Protection forced a number of crew members from a Great Lakes cruise ship to disembark last week.

No reason was given for the crew members' removal.

Thirteen crew members of two Victory Cruise Lines ships were forced to disembark during planned calls in Detroit, with eight taken from Victory I and five from Victory II.

"A limited number of Victory Cruise Lines crew were recently removed from Victory I and Victory II by US Customs and Border Protection," Chair John Waggoner confirmed.

Aurora's sea trials

AURORA Expeditions' soon-to-be-launched third ship Douglas Mawson has successfully completed her sea trials off the coast of China.

Prior to joining the fleet later this year, the ship underwent tests to verify her systems meet stringent quality, safety, and efficiency requirements.

Douglas Mawson will carry up to 249 passengers, and once in operation, will initially sail in Tasmania, before embarking on her first expeditions to East Antarctica from Hobart and Dunedin.

Next year will see Douglas Mawson relocate to the Mediterranean as part of Aurora's push to explore outside the poles (*CW* 05 Sep). Aurora currently sails two other vessels.
