







Get a taste of Norwegian

NORWEGIAN Cruise Line (NCL) will introduce its first-ever taster cruises in Australia in 2026/27 on board Norwegian Spirit.

The much-loved local NCL ship, which is set to make her return to Australia later this year, will embark on two four-night 'Tasmania Taster' cruises, pitched at those who are new to either the sector or the brand.

The Sydney round trips will depart on 06 and 21 Jan 2027.

Spirit will also sail on nine departures from Sydney - the most ever for NCL - including two 11-day round trips featuring overnight calls in both Melbourne and Adelaide, offering plenty of time for an in-depth exploration of wine regions such as the Yarra

Valley, Derwent Valley, McLaren Vale, the Adelaide Hills and the Barossa Vallev.

Additional season highlights will include calls in Hobart and Kangaroo Island, as well as NCL's first-ever visit to Phillip Island.

The program will begin with a 12-day South Pacific sailing from Lautoka to Sydney in Nov 2026, featuring four Fiji calls, visits to Port Vila and Mystery Island in Vanuatu, and NCL's first stop in Newcastle since 2019.

A series of 11-day open-jaw sailings between Sydney and Auckland will conclude the season, with scenic journeys through New Zealand's fjords, vibrant cities, and coastal gems.

The new season release comes as Norwegian counts down to the return of Spirit to Australia for her 2025/26 season.

She will arrive in Fremantle on 09 Dec before sailing Southern

Half of the cruise line's vessels have been built at Meyer Werft, which will also deliver a fourth ship in 2027 (CW 12 Aug 2024).

"We are delighted to deliver Disney Destiny to Disney Cruise Line today," said Meyer Werft Chief Executive Bernd Eikens, who signed the delivery documents together with **Disney Signature Experiences** President Joe Schott.

Destiny will sail on fourand five-night cruises to the Bahamas and Caribbean during her inaugural season.

SPIRIT of the Coorong, South Australia's newest tourist drawcard, invites travellers to sip and sail.

What was once a passenger boat in the Gippsland Lakes known as Maranui, has been transformed into the state's most scenic gin bar.

The 127-year-old vessel has just launched its 2025/26 Gin Flight Cruise schedule - a 90-minute experience that combines native botanicals, artisan gin, and breathtaking views of the Coorong region.

"We've got this beautiful little historic wooden boat that was largely underutilised," said General Manager Joel Hirsch.

"It only seats 12 people, so it's quite intimate and bespoke.

"I wanted to build a food and wine experience, but in a different way."

Tickets cost \$85pp, which includes three tastings, or \$245 for a date package for two.

New Cote d'Azur cruise rules

FRENCH authorities have unveiled unified cruise regulations for a number of ports in the country's Riviera, with pax disembarkation set to be capped at 3,000 per port per stopover

Destinations including Nice, Villefranche-sur-Mer, Beaulieusur-Mer, and Cannes will be subject to the new regulations, which will also require each destination's annual average to remain below 2,000 passengers per port per stopover, as reported by local media.

A maximum of just 15 ships per month will be allowed during the Jul and Aug high season.

Prefect of the Alpes-Maritimes Laurent Hottiaux and Mediterranean Maritime Prefect Christophe Lucas unveiled the new regulations late last week.

Ships scheduled to call in the region that carry more than 3,000 passengers include Norwegian Cruise Line's Norwegian Breakaway and Norwegian Epic; MSC Cruises' MSC Seaview; and many others.

Restrictions are expected to take effect from the 2026 season, and implemented gradually, to



allow for calls which have been scheduled in advance.

The final decision will now be presented to the public for comments, before it is finalised.

The local maritime union endorsed the approach, describing it as a balance between local economic contribution and upholding of environmental expectations.

These new regulations follow months of tension over sustainable cruise management along the Cote d'Azur.

Mayor of Nice Christian Estrosi earlier this year attempted to board Royal Caribbean's Voyager of the Seas, in order to force her to leave (CW 07 Jul). MS

HAL Asia 2027-28

HOLLAND America Line (HAL) is introducing three new ports for its freshly unveiled 2027-28 Asia season, with the line sailing to Hitachinaka, Nagoya, and Maizuru in Japan for the first time.

Between Sep 2027 and Apr 2028, Noordam will offer 15 itineraries ranging between 13-15 days, featuring overnight stays in Ha Long Bay, Vietnam; Seoul, South Korea; Bangkok, Thailand; Manila, Philippines; Osaka, Japan; and Shanghai, China.

Highlights include the 14-day 'Circle Japan', which takes guests to destinations such as Honshu, Shikoku and Kyushu, and the 'Japan & South Korea Discovery', which features the lesser-visited Jeju and includes an overnight call at Incheon.

"We know our guests are eager for deeper exploration, so this season we've added new ports, increased calls to lesser-visited destinations and provided extended stays in popular locales," said Director of Deployment & Itinerary Planning Robert de Bruin.
