NCLH orders three

SHIPBUILDER Fincantieri has secured an order for three new cruise ships for Norwegian Cruise Line Holdings (NCLH) for the company's three brands.

The vessels will be built for Norwegian Cruise Line, Oceania Cruises, and Regent Seven Seas Cruises (RSSC), with deliveries scheduled for 2036 and 2037.

Each vessel will be a sister ship to the most recent Fincantieri ship built for the three lines, which, by this time, will be *Norwegian Aura*, Oceania's Sonata class 4 ship, and RSSC's Prestige class 3.

NCLH now has a total of 17 new-builds on order.

Azamara capitalising on market gaps

AZAMARA Cruises is continuing to add capacity in Australia, as its "relaxed luxury" format resonates with locals.

Director of sales Victoria Chigwidden (**pictured**) told *Cruise Weekly* the departure of other lines from Australia has allowed Azamara to capitalise, responding to local demand for its voyages.

"We're sitting as the number two market globally," Chigwidden said, confirming Azamara's 12% market share in Australia.

"We've continued to flourish, as Azamara product resonates with Australians," she added.

The cruise line's next few seasons will see more pre-Christmas voyages added, which Chigwidden believes will lead extra travellers to consider it.

"It's giving our guests an opportunity to sail with us because we're here longer,



but to also take a holiday, but not necessarily have to do the Christmas time cruise if they don't wish to," she explained.

Longer seasons in Australia have allowed Azamara to add new ports to its schedule, such as K'gari, and bring back popular calls from the past like Brisbane.

Chigwidden said Azamara's commitment to diversifying its Australian itineraries each season

created greater guest retention.

"We've got something different to offer," she said.

"We're doing that to accommodate the Australian market, because the demand is there," Chigwidden explained.

"I think it will spark our clients, and maybe those guests who have been on that particular cruise but don't want to go on the same sailing again." MS



Le Commandant-Charcot

Today's issue of *CW* is coming to you courtesy of Ponant Explorations, which is this week hosting us aboard *Le Commandant-Charcot*.

TODAY *Cruise Weekly* will disembark Ponant Explorations' luxury icebreaker *Le Commandant-Charcot*, which is docked in Hobart this week.

The ship is now preparing to sail for Cape Town, following her inaugural visit to Australia.

This is *Le Commandant-Charcot*'s first-ever visit to Australia, and is currently scheduled to be her last local call for two years.

She will arrive back in Hobart in 2028 amid her first-ever circumnavigation of Antarctica.

A&K commences build of second Nile ship

ABERCROMBIE & Kent (A&K) has celebrated the keel-laying of its second Nile riverboat (render pictured), which took place at The Arab Contractors shipyard.

The maritime tradition marks the joining of a vessel's first structural components, beginning construction for the as-yet-unnamed riverboat, scheduled to launch in 2028.

She will feature 32 suites for just 64 guests, mirroring the design and spacious accommodations of *Nile Seray*, which is scheduled to launch later this year.

Like her sister, the new vessel will offer suites with a minimum of 33m², floor-to-ceiling windows, and waterside Juliet balconies.

Her two grandest suites will boast full private balconies with outdoor spa pools.

The vessel will feature two restaurants, a spa with two treatment rooms, a well-



equipped gymnasium, a top deck with canopied daybeds, swimming pool, and an outdoor bar with wrap-around views of the Nile valley.

"Celebrating this keel laying represents another important step in our commitment to Egypt," Abercrombie & Kent Travel Group chief executive officer Cristina Levis said.

"The construction of this second vessel reflects both the tremendous interest we've seen from travellers and our confidence in Egypt's enduring appeal as a destination.

"Working with The Arab Contractors demonstrates our dedication to Egyptian craftsmanship and supporting the local economy," she said. *MS*

THE Spirit of Tasmania has leapt into action to help save seven stranded people after their boat capsized.

Emergency services were called when a boat capsized in Corio Bay off Geelong at about 8.20pm, with a large police operation launched, involving the marine unit, water police and Air Wing.

Fortunately, the *Spirit of Tasmania* ferry, which was nearby at the time, also deployed rescue boats, bringing aboard the capsized boat's seven occupants.

The lucky sailors were brought to safety and medically assessed at the scene.

What caused their boat to capsize is under investigation.

Swan hits a hole-in-one



SWAN Hellenic has announced a golf excursion package as part of its Lisbon to Fuerteventura voyage in Sep, which will see guests get to play on five of the most prestigious golf courses in the world.

The six-night 'Atlantic Horizons: From Portugal to the Canary Islands' cruise will depart Lisbon aboard *Diana* on 07 Sep.

Guests will be able to play Palmares Ocean Living & Golf in Portugal, Costa Teguise Golf Club in Spain, and The Tony Jacklin Casablanca, Mogador Golf Club and Golf du Soleil in Morocco.

The package includes all transfers, green fees, manual trolleys, driving range warm-ups when time allows, and halfway refreshments provided by each prestigious club.

Full care service is also included, from baggage handling and shoe shining to club cleaning.

E-trolley and e-cart reservations are offered subject to availability at additional cost, and additional rounds can also be booked alongside the main package.

Golfers are allowed around four-and-a-half to five hours to

complete their rounds.

Swan Hellenic is offering the package at a per-person price of US\$375 (approximately A\$530) per course or US\$1,500 (approximately \$2,120) for the complete five-course package.
